They are not intended for those seeking initial or advanced training as teachers for whom there is a separate scheme under the Commonwealth Teacher Training Bursary.
- 3. Tenure.—The Scholarship is tenable for a programme of study or research normally extending over a period of two academic years and leading to a University degree or similar qualification. In some cases an award may be made for one academic year only and in appropriate circumstances (e.g., a post-graduate course that may require three years to complete) the award may be extended for a third year.
- 4. Emoluments.—The emoluments will cover expenses of travel, living and study during tenure of the scholarship as well as an initial clothing grant and a marriage allowance in the case of scholars accompanied by their wives.
- 5. Eligibility.—Candidates must be graduates of a University or College or holders of an equivalent qualification. They must be NIGERIANS and normally resident in this country. Only in exceptional cases may consideration be given to those who are already studying in the Commonwealth country of their choice.
