FIREARMS (DELEGATION OF POWERS OF INSPECTOR-GENERAL) NOTICE 1959

To grant import licences for personal and muzzle-loading firearms and ammunition under section 20 (d) of the Ordinance and to impose terms and conditions in respect thereof.

To grant permits for repairing personal firearms under section 24 of the Ordinance.

To grant permits to manufacture and repair muzzle-loading firearms under section 25 of the Ordinance.

To issue permits for the withdrawal of firearms and the purchase and withdrawal of ammunition from an armoury under regulation 5 (1) of the Firearms Regulations, 1959.

To require persons, in charge of registered dealers' armouries to employ watchmen under regulation 14 of the Firearms Regulations, 1959 and detail the hours of duty of such watchmen.

To authorise the withdrawal of personal firearms and ammunition therefor from registered dealers' armouries under regulation 17 (1) (a) of the Firearms Regulations, 1959.

To authorise the withdrawal of personal firearms and ammunition therefor from public armouries under regulation 20 (1) (a) of the Firearms Regulations, 1959.

The Inspector-General of Police may at any time revoke the delegation of powers herein contained and on the publication of the notice of such revocation the delegation shall cease.

NIGERIA POPULATION CENSUS 1962 LAGOS TOWNSHIP

Applications are invited for posts of census enumerators and supervisors in connection with the forthcoming census of Nigeria. About 600 enumerators and 120 supervisors will be required; a supervisor will be expected to supervise the work of at least five enumerators. Teachers in both secondary and primary schools in Lagos and persons from the ranks of Third and Second Class Clerks, up to the grade of Assistant Executive Officers, in Government Departments are especially invited to apply. A SUSTAINS.

2. The Ministry of Education has already arranged for the holidays of both primary and secondary schools in Lagos to fall within the period of census enumeration, so that teachers who are selected will be free to devote their full time to census work. The census enumeration period is 13th May to the 27th May 1962 inclusive. The general census enumeration will be followed almost immediately by a post enumeration survey lasting for a week, and all supervisors and also a number of enumerators of proved ability will be expected to work for an additional seven days from Monday, the 28th May, to about 6th June, 1962 inclusive.

3. With regard to Government officials other than teachers referred to in the preceding paragraph, the Ministry of Establishments has no objection to their appointment as enumerators or supervisors, provided they work in their offices from 8 a.m. to 11.30 a.m. daily, before being released for census work. Subject to the above limitations, enumerators and supervisors will be expected to devote their full time to census work during the period 13th May to 27th May, 1962 inclusive and to attend some instructional classes outside normal office hours, prior to the commencement of the field work.

4. Enumerators will be paid a fee of $\pounds 9$ each for their services. Supervisors will receive a higher fee of $\pounds 15$ each to compensate for the added responsibilities. Supervisors and those enumerators selected to carry out the post enumeration survey will each receive additional remuneration of $\pounds 4-10s-0d$.

5. For general information, the three Federal Constituencies in Lagos are regarded as Census Districts; these are :---

.Census District 1-Comprising Town Council Wards A, B and D.

Census District 2-Comprising Town Council Wards E and F.

Census District 3—Comprising Town Council Wards C, F and H.

For the posts of supervisors, Headmasters, Assistant Chief Clerks, Chief Clerks and Assistant Executive Officers, will be considered.
