Applications are invited for undergraduate scholarships tenable from July 1962, at Makerere University College, which is in special relation with the University of London, for the following courses:

3. B.A. Honours (in English, Geography, History or Mathematics) Followed by a one-year post-graduate Diploma in Education.

The purpose of the scholarships, which are made possible by a generous grant from the U.S. Government through the Agency for International Development, is:

1. To supplement the supply of secondary school teachers, and of men and women with a knowledge of finance or public administration.

2. To encourage contacts between East African students and those from other parts of the continent.

Whilst the funds for these scholarships are provided by the Agency for International Development of the United States, it is emphasized that the responsibility of the A.I.D. extends only to providing the funds, and the award of the scholarships is entirely in the hands of the College authorities.

Entrance requirements are approximately the same as for external students of the University of London, with some variation in language requirements. Therefore only those candidates should apply who hold Higher School Certificates, or advanced level passes in the G.C.E. or approved equivalent, or those who are expecting to receive results during March 1962.

The scholarships cover:
