 - (f) to arrange for checkweighing and inspection at port in accordance with the regulations;
 - (g) to arrange for delivery of cocoa to ocean going vessel or the Board's Stores, Apapa, and to hand without delay shipping documents as required to the Nigerian Produce Marketing Company Limited

- 4. Minimum conditions—(a) Purchases.—Applicants must produce evidence of ability to purchase with reasonable regularity throughout a season a minimum of 400 tons of cocoa (i.e., Main and Light crops inclusive);
- (b) Bags and Twine.—"B" Twill bags will be supplied licensed buying agents by the Board. Applicants must however produce evidence of ability to provide sufficient twine to cover at least the minimum purchase requirement;
