SOVIET SCHOLARSHIPS FOR NIGERIANS

The course of study of Science in these institutions lasts five years and in Engi-neering subjects six years. Foreign students who are in need of clothing get it at the expense of the University or Institute at the rate of 300 rubles for the whole course. Text books and other training appliances are provided free of charge. The University or Institute in Russia provides every foreign student with a sum of money up to 150 rubles a month during the vacation.

5. Commencement of scholarships.-Successful candidates are expected to arrive in the U.S.S.R. scholarships .--- Successful by mid-August, 1962.

6. (c) In exceptional cases, consideration might be given to a candidate who does not possess the academic qualifications mentioned above but who had a good education and had attained a high standard of proficiency in English provided he had at least five years suitable experience in Journalism, publicity work or broadcasting.
