## SOVIET SCHOLARSHIPS FOR NIGERIANS

Applications are invited from suitably qualified Nigerians for scholarships offered to Nigeria by the Soviet Union. These Scholarships are available in the fields of Engineering, Science and Arts, details of which are shown below:—

2. *Conditions of award.*—Candidates who receive these scholarships would be expected to follow the course of their choice of study at one or other of the Soviet Universities or Institutions which cater for Foreign students. The course of study of Science in these institutions lasts five years and in Engineering subjects six years. In either case, there is a preparatory period of one extra year during which the students will be expected to study the Russian language and pursue a course of subjects of a general scientific nature, such as Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and others. In the case of post-graduate students, there will also be a one-year Russian language course. This will be followed by a three-year research in the applicant's field of specialty.

3. Successful applicants will be expected to live in Hostel accommodations and dining rooms, together with Soviet students.

4. *Value of scholarships.*—Recipients will be paid the normal stipend for foreign students in Russia which is 90 rubles (about £36) a month and the hostel fee of one ruble 50 copecks (about 10s) a month. Foreign students who are in need of clothing get it at the expense of the University or Institute at the rate of 300 rubles for the whole course. Text books and other training appliances are provided free of charge. The University or Institute in Russia provides every foreign student with a sum of money up to 150 rubles a month during the vacation.

5. *Commencement of scholarships.*—Successful candidates are expected to arrive in the U.S.S.R. by mid-August, 1962.

6. *Method of application.*—Candidates are required to apply in their own hand-writing, stating clearly their names, age, qualifications, colleges attended, marital status, employment since leaving school or college and the course of study desired. Candidates are normally expected to be free from bonds and in the case of bonded candidates, there must be documentary evidence of release duly signed by the benefactor.

7. All applications must be accompanied by the following documents:—

- (c) Birth Certificate or Statutory Declaration of Age;
