 - (i) every consignment shall be examined and sealed by the proper officer at the customs port of importation, or at a place approved by the Board for this purpose, before despatch for re-exportation;
 - (ii) the goods shall be exported from Maiduguri by the most direct route across the frontier;
 - (c) Mfum on the road from Enugu to the Federal Republic of Cameroon."
