## AMENDMENT No. 5

Government Notice No. 704 of 1959 (Customs and Excise Notice No. 16) published in Federal Gazette No. 21 dated 1st April, 1959 is amended by inserting paragraph 4 as follows :—

"4. *Approved Routes for Exportation.*—The Board has approved the following places to be the routes through which goods may be exported on drawback :—

(1) All customs ports and customs airports.

(2) Inland Water : the customs station at—

Yola on the River Benue, for goods for exportation to the Federal Republic of Cameroon.

(3) Overland : the customs stations at—

(a) Idiroko on the road from Lagos to Dahomey ;

(b) Maiduguri on the roads entering Nigeria through Dar-el-Jimeil and through Gamboru, for TEA and LIQUID PETROLEUM GAS IN BOTTLES, subject to the following conditions :—

(i) every consignment shall be examined and sealed by the proper officer at the customs port of importation, or at a place approved by the Board for this purpose, before despatch for re-exportation ;

(ii) the goods shall be exported from Maiduguri by the most direct route across the frontier ;

(c) Mfum on the road from Enugu to the Federal Republic of Cameroon."
