Registration under the National Provident Fund Act, 1961

NATIONAL PROVIDENT FUND NOTICE TO EMPLOYERS

The attention of employers and workers is drawn to the fact that by 1st October, 1962, the undermentioned classes of employers should have registered themselves and their covered workers under the National Provident Fund Act, 1961, and commenced to pay contributions:

Federal Government departments; regional governments and Federal public corporations; Private employers with 400 or more workers;

Private employers with not less than ten workers; local government authorities (except for native authorities in the Northern Region); regional public corporations; non-government educational institutions; and corporate bodies (with not less that 10 workers) set up otherwise than under the Companies Ordinance for purposes connected with religion, education, research, welfare; sport, local government, co-operative effort and banking.

- 2. Any of the employers listed above who has not yet registered himself and his workers is warned that it is an offence under section 35 (1) of the Act, punishable on summary conviction by a fine not exceeding £100 or by imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months or by both such fine and imprisonment. Moreover, delay or failure on the part of an employer to get himself and his workers registered may result in his being unable to make the necessary deduction of the worker's share of the contributions from his wages since in this event the employer would be called upon from the appointed day for contributions to bear not only his own contributions but also those of the workers.
- 3. Defaulting employers are therefore warned, in their own interest, to take steps to register themselves and their covered workers without any further delay so that the Fund may not be under the necessity of taking legal proceedings.

NATIONAL PROVIDENT FUND DEDUCTION OF CONTRIBUTIONS FROM WAGES

Contributions under the National Provident Fund Act, 1961, for and in respect of the undermentioned workers will take effect from 1st October, 1962:

Covered workers employed by-

Private employers with not less than ten and not more than 399; local government authorities (except for native authorities in the Northern Region); regional public corporations; non-government educational institutions; and corporate bodies (with not less than 10 workers) set up otherwise than under the Companies Ordinance for purposes connected with religion, education, research, welfare, sport, local government, cooperative effort and banking.

2. Contributions are at the rate of 3d for every complete 5s of wages paid to a worker for each month and will be deducted from the worker's wages by the employer who will add an equivalent sum and pay the total amount to the National Provident Fund.

- 3. The first deductions from the wages of the workers mentioned will be made from wages paid for the month of October.
- 4. The deductions made from month to month from the worker's wages, together with the equivalent sum contributed for that worker by his employer, will be credited to the worker's account in the National Provident Fund.
- 5. The employer contributions which will be made by the above-mentioned employers in respect of their casual workers under section 13 of the National Provident Fund (General) Regulations, 1961, will also be with effect from 1st October, 1962.

WESTERN REGION MARKETING BOARD

1962-63 COCOA MARKETING SCHEME—MINIMUM BUYING STATION PRICES

It is notified for general information that the Western Region Marketing Board, by virtue of its powers under section 16 (a) of the Marketing Board Law (Cap. 75 of the Laws of the Western Region of Nigeria, 1959), has fixed the prices set out in columns II and III of the schedule subjoined as the minimum prices payable for cocoa during the 1962-63 season at gazetted buying stations in the Western Region specified in column I.

 The minimum buying station prices are based on the naked ex-scale port of shipment prices fixed by the Board for the 1962-63 season less the transport differentials by the approved evacuation routes.

PRODUCE SALES TAX

- 3. Under the provisions of the Western Region Produce Sales Tax Law (Cap. 99 of the Laws of the Western Region of Nigeria, 1959), all sales of cocoa made in the Western Region to the licensed buying agents of the Western Region Marketing Board are subject to produce sales tax at the rate of £4 per ton.
- 4. For purposes of collection of this tax, for which under the Western Region Produce Sales Tax Law, 1957 the Marketing Board is accountable to the appropriate regional authority in respect of all sales of cocoa made to it or to its licensed buying agents in the Region the arrangements as set out in paragraph 5 are prescribed.
- 5. The prices payable by the licensed buying agents of the Marketing Board for cocoa in the Western Region will take into account the incidence of produce sales tax and will accordingly be at the rates set out in columns IV and V of the schedule subjoined (being the minimum buying station prices fixed by the Marketing Board reduced by the amount of produce sales tax).


