Constitution of the Federation of Nigeria

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Doctor NNAMDI AZIKIWE, Member of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria.

NNAMDI AZIKIWE, Governor-General

Whereas by subsection (2) of section 104 of the Constitution of the Federation of Nigeria it is provided that the Judges of the Federal Supreme Court shall be:—(a) The Chief Justice of the Federation; (b) any such number of Federal Justices (not being less than three) as may be prescribed by Parliament; and (c) the Chief Justice of each territory.

AND WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (1) of section 3 of the Federal Supreme Court Act, 1960 as amended by the Adaptation of Laws (Federal Provisions) Order, 1960, that the number of Federal Justices of the Federal Supreme Court shall be five.

AND WHEREAS the number of Federal Justices of the Federal Supreme Court is now three in addition to the Chief Justice of the Federation.

AND WHEREAS by subsection (5) of section 105 of the said Constitution of the Federation, it is further provided that if the Office of any Federal Justice is vacant, the Governor-General acting in accordance with the advice of the Judicial Service Commission of the Federation may appoint a person qualified to hold the Office of a Federal Justice to act in the Office of a Federal Justice.

Now Therefore, I, NNAMDI AZIKIWE, Member of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria, do hereby, in accordance with the advice of the Judicial Service Commission of the Federation of Nigeria, appoint Charles Dadi Onyeama to act in the Office of a Federal Justice as from the 22nd day of October, 1962, and until the 11th day of November, 1962.

DRAWBACK

Customs and Excise Notice No. 16

AMENDMENT No. 6

Government Notice No. 704 of 1959 published in the Federation of Nigeria Official Gazette Extraordinary No. 21 of 1st April, 1959 is hereby amended as follows:-

- 1. Paragraph 6. Delete and substitute :-
- "6. Production at Exportation.—(a) All drawback goods must be produced to the proper officer at the port or place of exportation, and the exporter must provide such samples, and give such assistance as may be required by the proper officer, so that an accurate account of the goods may be taken.

(b) All outer packages of drawback goods are to be plainly marked "Exported on Drawback. To be

produced to Customs at exportation".

- 2. Insert the following as Part IV-MATERIALS (FIXED RATE) DRAWBACK:-"PART IV-MATERIALS (FIXED RATE) DRAWBACK"
- 30. General.—(a) In the case of certain composite goods wholly or partly containing duty paid ingredients and manufactured in Nigeria to standard formulas, the Board may grant to bona fide applicants a "fixed rate"
- (b) The "fixed rate" drawback procedure is designed to simplify and expedite the payment of drawback and its adoption is optional; if a manufacturer elects to adopt the "fixed rate" drawback procedure, however, he may not—in respect of the same class of goods—revert to other methods of claiming drawback without the prior approval of the Board.
 - (c) Approval for "fixed rate" drawback will normally be limited to importers or their agents who are :-

(i) manufacturers of goods for approved use :

- (ii) bona fide manufacturers of goods intended for exportation.
- 31. Definition.—"Fixed rate" drawback is a drawback at a rate that has been calculated and fixed by the Board, in relation to the quantity of duty paid material required to produce a "unit of quantity" of finished goods. The "unit of quantity" will be determined by the Board according to the basis on which the goods are normally sold by the manufacturer.
- 32. Procedure.—"Fixed rate" drawback is an extension of the "materials' Drawback" scheme, and the directions in paragraphs 13 to 15, 17 to 20 and 23 of Part II of this Notice as well as the following requirements are to be followed.
- 33. Application for "Fixed Rate" Drawback.—(a) Manufacturers who wish to claim "fixed rate" drawback, will apply on Form Sale 2—Application for "Fixed Rate" Drawback—(Appendix 'A') in duplicate to the Board through the Chief Collector in charge of the Area where the industry is situated. Attention is drawn to the Note on the reverse of the application form.
 - (b) A separate application must be made in respect of each line of finished goods.
- 34. Materials for Packing and Packaging. (a) Materials, e.g., paper, cardboard, etc., on which duty has been paid and which are used in packing the units on which drawback is based may be taken into consideration in determining the "fixed rate".
 - (b) This provision will apply only where-
 - (i) the packing used is uniform:
 - (ii) the goods are in standard packs:
 - (iii) a request has been made in the "application" for the inclusion of the packing and packaging in the "fixed rate".
- 35. Formulas.—To facilitate the calculation and approval of a 'fixed rate', it is essential that the fullest information regarding the ingredients used—dutiable and otherwise—be given. Formulas will be treated as strictly confidential. Applications containing formulas should be forwarded in sealed inner packets conspicuously marked 'SECRET' and enclosed in outer packets. Both the inner and out packets are to be addressed-

The Secretary Board of Customs and Excise, Headquarters, Lagos-

and forwarded through the proper Chief Collector.

36. Tariff Changes.—It is to be especially noted that when there is a Tariff change reducing the rate of import duty on any ingredient for a 'fixed rate' line of goods, the reduced 'fixed rate' will be effective from the date of the Tariff change.

- 37. Alterations Affecting the 'Fixed Rate' .- (a) The following factors will affect the 'fixed rate' :-
- (i) alteration to the declared formula;
- (ii) in the case of goods containing ingredients on which duty was paid at an ad valorem rate, any change in the C.I.F. value;
 - (iii) change in the rate of duty for any ingredient.
- (b) In any of the foregoing circumstances, the manufacturer is required to make fresh application without delay to the Board, showing the effective date of the change.
- (c) It is emphasised that it is obligatory for a manufacturer to notify the Board immediately of any change in the factors affecting the 'fixed rate'.
- 38. Special Requirements.—(a) Materials to be stored separately. Stocks of duty paid materials to be used as ingredients of finished goods, must be stored separately from other materials at the manufacturer's premises. Should the proper officer wish to take stock at any time, the stock must be balanced, and the manufacturer is required to give every assistance to the proper officer in taking a true account of the stock.
- (b) Packing list and marking at packing.—Goods must be packed in conformity with a packing list pre-pared for each consignment, clearly showing the number of internal packages and their trade description as defined in the Merchandise Marks Act, Cap. 117. Goods must also be marked to the satisfaction of the Board (i.e., by means of packing tickets, labels, tags, brand or line name or any other identifying mark so that they are readily identifiable).
- (c) Check of stock, records, premises and appliances.—The proper officer of Customs and Excise may at any time, with or without notice, check or examine any records or stocks of goods, the premises, instruments or appliances used, and the owner or his agent must make convenient access available to the proper officer.
- 39. Approval of 'Fixed Rate'.—From the formula supplied by the manufacturer, the Board will calculate a drawback money value for the duty paid ingredients used in the manufacture of a 'unit of quantity' of the finished goods. The drawback value, so calculated becomes the 'fixed rate' per 'unit of quantity' of the finished goods, and will be advised to the manufacturer on Form C 158—Notification in respect of Materials (Fixed Rate) Drawback—(Appendix 'B') together with Form C 159—Approval of Materials (Fixed Rate) Drawback (Appendix 'C')—in duplicate. On receipt of Form C 159 the manufacturer will signify his acceptance by signing the Undertaking on Part I of the forms, and return them to the Board.
 - (b) Part II of Form C 159 will be returned to the manufacturer by the Board.
- 40.—Effective Date.—'Fixed rate' drawback will only apply to goods despatched from a manufacturer's premises on or after the date of the original application, or notification of any change in the factors affecting the rate. Pending notification by the Board of the approved rates, all new and altered lines must be entered separately on Form Sale 4—Export Entry for Drawback (Fixed Rate) Goods—(Appendix 'D') and the words 'Fixed Rate Applied For' shown under "Particulars of 'Fixed Rate' Drawback Approval" on the Entry Form.
- 41. Entry.—Goods for exportation on 'fixed rate' drawback must be pre-entered in sextuplicate on the Form SALE 4.
- 42. Payment of 'Fixed Rate' Drawback.—Claim for payment of 'fixed rate' drawback will be made on Form Sale 5—Drawback (Fixed Rate) Debenture (Appendix 'E')—in triplicate, addressed to the Chief Collector in charge of the Area where the industry is situated. Separate claims will be made for goods exported or for use as aircraft's/ships' stores and goods delivered for approved use in Nigeria.
 - 43. Minimum Claim.—A fixed rate drawback claim for an amount less than £50 will not be entertained.
- 44. Warning.—(a) The Board reserves the right to adjust a 'fixed rate' drawback or to withdraw the approval of a 'fixed rate' as it thinks fit.
- (b) Any person giving information which is found to be untrue will be liable to penalties under the Customs and Excise laws.
