NOTES

(1) Item 35 'South East Ikoyi', Items 36, 37 and 38 'Victoria Island', Item 39 (2) Street Lighting and Item 40 'Ijora Site Development' are being carried out by the Board as agents of the Nigerian Federal Government who pay the contractors, etc., direct. The expenditure involved is included at Items 35, 36, 37, 38, 39 (2) and 40 for statistical purposes only; and is deducted from Item 44 to obtain the figures taken into the Balance Sheet Item 45.

(2) Item 21 (6) *Ex-gratia* Compensation Fund expenditure is limited to £200,000 for the Scheme as a whole. This sum is met from the Nigerian Federal Government grant for the Scheme.

(3) Items 36, 37 and 38 'Victoria Island', £40,000 has been advanced to the Board by the Nigerian Federal Government to defray the cost of compensation removal and resettlement of villagers. Compensations, etc., paid to 31st March, 1962 totalled £25,690-3s-5d. The unspent balance of £14,309-16s-7d has been included in the Balance Sheet as a liability, 'Sundry Creditors'.

Items 41, 42 and 43.

(4) As at 31-3-62 expenditure (£203,530-16s-11d) exceeded income (£138,177-3s-0d) by £65,353-13s-11d. The Nigerian Federal Government has, however, included loan provision of £60,000 for Staff Quarters in the last economic programme of which £30,000 was taken up this year. Excess of expenditure over income to date is therefore £35,353-13s-11d.
