TELEPHONE EXCHANGE LINES, PRIVATE WIRES AND TELEX EXCHANGE LINES

The following conditions of installation of telephone exchange lines, private wires (both telephone and telegraph) and telex exchange lines, which will have effect as from 1st December, 1962, are published for general information. Government Notice No. 1253 dated 27th December, 1951, concerning the conditions of installation of telephones, is hereby cancelled.

1.—DEFINITIONS

In these conditions :—

(a) the expression "rental" includes rental for extension lines, or additional apparatus or additional mileage ;

(b) the expression "certified" means certified over a signature purporting to be the signature of an officer of the Posts and Telegraphs Division and such certificate shall be conclusive evidence of the matters certified without proof of the signature of such officer of his appointment ;

(c) the expression "subscriber's premises" means and includes any premises where the telephone exchange line, private wire or telex exchange line is installed ;

(d) the expressions "telephone exchange line", "private wire" and "telex exchange line" mean and include the lines, extension lines, and apparatus installed in the subscribers premises ;

(e) the expression "circuit" means and includes both telephone exchange lines, private wires and telex exchange lines ;

(f) the title "Director of Posts and Telegraphs" means the officer appointed as Director of Posts and Telegraphs of Nigeria or appointed to act in that capacity on behalf of the Government of Nigeria or his accredited representative ;

(g) the expression "effective call" means

(i) *For Telephones*.—a call which places the person in attendance at the originating subscriber's telephone in a position to converse with some person attending at the telephone of the distant subscriber.

(ii) *For Telex*.—a call which places the person in attendance at the originating telex subscriber's teleprinter in a position to communicate with some person attending at the teleprinter of the distant telex subscriber or in a position to record a communication on the teleprinter of the distant telex subscriber if that machine is temporarily unattended.

II.—CONDITIONS

1. The Director of Posts and Telegraphs undertakes to instal the circuits and maintain them in good order. Repairs will be effected with all possible dispatch, but the Director of Posts and Telegraphs will not be held liable in damages or otherwise for any delay in such repair of for any loss or damage, occasioned by the total or partial interruption of the circuits, nor will any abatement be made from the rental unless the circuit shall have been totally interrupted for a continuous period of at least fourteen days. The circuit will be considered to be in working order unless notification to the contrary made by the subscriber is accepted by the Director of Posts and Telegraphs.

2. The Director of Posts and Telegraphs, while reserving to himself the right to require any intending subscriber to enter into an agreement to hire a circuit for a period not exceeding five years, will normally be prepared to instal a circuit upon the subscriber paying in advance the first three months rental, and any other charges that may, from time to time, be decided upon, and in the case of private wires and telex exchange lines only, upon the subscriber entering into an agreement to hire a circuit for a minimum period of three months. The Director of Posts and Telegraphs will then continue the service subject to the following conditions :—

(a) *Rentals*.—After the lapse of the period for which the initial rental has been paid rentals are payable quarterly in advance ; the second payment will be, however, only for the period up to the following 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, or 31st December as the case may be.

(b) *Fees and Charges*.—The renter of a telephone or telex exchange line will be required to

pay on demand all fees and charges on account of calls passed over the circuit, and the subscriber is not relieved of the responsibility for payment of any unauthorised calls originated on his circuit.

(c) Delay in payment

(i) If the rental and such fees and charges as have been incurred, be not paid within thirty-five days from the date of the certified account, the Director of Posts and Telegraphs may disconnect the circuit and such other circuits as may be provided without further notice.

(ii) If the rental and such fees and charges as have been incurred be paid during the period between thirty-five and forty-nine days from the date of the certified account, together with a reconnection fee prescribed, the Director of Posts and Telegraphs will reconnect the circuits that may have been disconnected.

(iii) If the rental and such fees and charges as have been incurred be not paid within fifty days from the date of the certified account, the Director of Posts and Telegraphs may remove from the subscriber's premises without further notice the circuit and such other circuits as may be provided. The subscriber will not be liable for rental after this removal has taken place, and any agreement he has made with the Director of Posts and Telegraphs will be deemed to have been terminated.

(iv) The reconnection fee prescribed will not be accepted by the Director of Posts and Telegraphs after forty-nine days from the date of the certified account. 3. 4. Cessation of hiring—A subscriber is required to give at least three months' notice in writing of his intention to discontinue the hiring of the circuit, or to pay three months' rental in lieu of notice. In no circumstances will any part of the first three months' rental be refunded. 5. Vacation of premises—If the subscriber vacates the premises in which the circuit is fitted, the Director of Posts and Telegraphs shall be at liberty to recover the circuit and hold the same for safe custody or to remove the circuit or to rent the same to another person without in any way affecting the subscriber's liabilities.

10. Restriction of use—The subscriber shall agree to the following restrictions in the use of the circuit:—

(a) The Director of Posts and Telegraphs may disconnect the circuit and remove it from the subscriber's premises if any improper or obscene message or conversation is transmitted over the circuit.

(b) If the number of ineffective calls to any telephone exchange line or telex exchange line amounts to twenty-five per cent of the total number of calls to that line, the Director of Posts and Telegraphs may require the subscriber to rent an additional telephone exchange line or telex exchange line and may terminate without notice the agreement of any telephone or telex subscriber who refuses to fulfil such requirement.

(c) The subscriber shall not, except with the prior written consent of the Director of Posts and Telegraphs, transfer, assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any circuit, or part of a circuit, hired to him by the Director of Posts and Telegraphs or any right in connection therewith, and upon any breach of this condition the Director of Posts and Telegraphs may enter the premises, disconnect the circuit and may remove it and such other circuits as may be provided, and the subscriber shall be liable for the expenses incurred in so doing.

11. Telegraph Ordinance—The regulations applying to the provision of apparatus in the Telegraph Ordinance shall apply equally to private wires and telex exchange lines.

12. Change in rates and conditions—Three calendar month's notice will be given in the *Federation of Nigeria Official Gazette* of any change in these conditions.
