Federal Territory of Nigeria. Candidates, who are eligible and intend to apply for the latter awards at a later date, are free to apply for the open awards as well.

- 5. Candidates should not assume that scholarships will cover all costs of study or training, though in all cases they will cover tuition fees.
- 6. Candidates are advised to acquaint themselves with the conditions of admission to the Courses of study or training they wish to take up and ensure that they hold the necessary academic qualifications. The following points should be noted:—
- (a) for university degree courses.—the qualifications required are the General Certificate of Education at Advanced Level or the Higher School Certificate at Principal Level in subjects appropriate to the intended course of study, in addition to evidence of a general education to the level of the West African School Certificate, Grade II or its equivalent;

In those cases where it appears to the Federal Scholarships' Advisory Board that places for courses of study or training are not available in Nigeria or West Africa, arrangements will, at the Board's discretion, be made to place successful candidates in overseas institutions. This will be done primarily by the utilisation of scholarship offers from foreign governments and institutions and from international organisations. However, applicants for courses marked "Overseas" in paragraph 2 above are also advised to apply for provisional admission to institutions of their choice through the Students Advisory Committee of the Federal Ministry of Education.
- 9. The particular attention of candidates who wish to apply from abroad is drawn to paragraph 2 above. They will not be awarded scholarships tenable abroad, if study or training in their chosen fields can be pursued in West Africa. Such candidates are therefore advised to apply promptly for admission to Nigerian institutions of learning. If offered a scholarship tenable in West Africa, they will be required to return to West Africa at their own expense.
- 10. Other Qualifications required.—(a) Applications for scholarships may be submitted by candidates of either sex who are Nigerian citizens and who are under 30 years of age on 1st January, 1963.
- (b) Successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination of fitness which will include a tuberculin test and an X-ray examination of the chest.
- 11. Bonding.—Successful candidates will be required to sign a bond to serve the Federation of Nigeria in any capacity approved by the Federal Government.

- 12. Application Forms.—Scholarship application forms are obtainable from:—
 - (a) The Federal Ministry of Education, Lagos;
 - (b) The Secretary, Northern Nigeria Scholarship Board, Kaduna;
 - (c) The Secretary, Eastern Nigeria Scholarship Board, Enugu;
 - (d) The Secretary, Western Nigeria Scholarship Board, Ibadan;
 - (e) All Nigerian High Commissions, Embassies and Consulates abroad;
 - (f) The Academic Registrars of all Nigerian Universities.

Candidates who want application forms to be sent to them by post from the Federal Ministry of Education, Lagos, should attach a self-addressed envelope marked "Scholarships F.G. 1963" in the left hand corner while applying for the forms.

- 13. Submission of application Forms.—Two copies of the completed forms—together with a passport-size photograph should be forwarded to the Permanent Secretary (Scholarship Section), Federal Ministry of Education, Lagos, so as to reach him not later than 20th April, 1963.
- 14: Warning.—It is important that candidates adhere strictly to the foregoing instructions as failure to do so may lead to rejection of the application of the particular candidate. No late applications will be entertained.
