HOURS OF ATTENDANCE BY OFFICERS OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE AND THE FEES PAYABLE FOR EXTRA ATTENDANCE

By virtue of section 9 of the Customs and Excise Management Act No. 55 of 1958, it is hereby notified that the hours during which public offices of the Department of Customs and Excise are open, or during which officers of Customs and Excise are available, for the performance of particular duties on all days except Sundays and public holidays are, subject to the provisions of paragraphs 4 and 6, as stated in Annex A.

2. Definitions :—

(a) "Indoor" and "Outdoor" Attendance.—Attendance is classified as either "Indoor" or "Outdoor". Any attendance which is not specified as "Outdoor" is "Indoor". "Outdoor" attendance consists of the following :—

- (i) boarding of ships and aircraft ;
- (ii) clearing of passengers and passengers' baggage ;
- (iii) landing and shipping operations, including the release of goods ;
- (iv) attendance at the licensed premises of an excise trader.

(b) Extra Attendance.—Extra attendance means attendance given by officers outside the prescribed hours and on Sundays and public holidays (see Annex A.)

3. Places at which attendance will not be provided.—Except by special arrangement or in exceptional cases, attendance will not be provided for service outside Approved wharves, Custom Houses, Customs Airports, Customs Areas, Customs Ports, Customs Stations, Government Warehouses, Licensed Excise premises, Licensed Warehouses and Parcels Post Depots.

4. Application for Extra Attendance.—(a) Persons requiring the extra attendance of officers must make application to the proper officer on Form 'Sale 10'—Application for Extra Attendance (see Annex B). If the request is granted, he must pay in advance the charges estimated to be payable. (See also, paragraph 5).

(b) Applications are to be made in good time to allow of suitable arrangements being made for the required attendance.

(c) The granting of an application is at the discretion of the proper officer who may refuse the request unless he is satisfied that a good reason exists for granting it.

(d) Attendance on Sundays and public holidays and between the hours of 10.30 p.m. and 6.00 a.m. will only be permitted in exceptional cases. Extra attendance before morning opening hours and during afternoon breaks may be given to the public only by special arrangement with the proper officer, and at least four working hours' prior notification is required for the former.

(e) Requests from applicants who are in default in the payment of charges on previous applications will not be granted until the account outstanding has been settled.

5. Waiver of Pre-payment.—(a) Waiver of pre-payment of charges may be granted in certain circumstances. Application for this concession is to be made on Form 'Sale 11'—Waiver of Pre-payment of charges for Extra Attendance—(see Annex C), in triplicate and addressed to the proper Collector.

(b) Prompt payment of charges.—(i) The attention of applicants for extra attendance is particularly invited to the undertaking embodied in the application Form 'Sale 10' that all charges must be paid within 7 days of the notification of charge.

(ii) Where charges are not paid within the stipulated time the concession will be withdrawn immediately.

6. Charges for Extra Attendance.

Nature of Service

Charges

For services rendered on request outside the prescribed hours of attendance, on Sundays or on public holidays.

7s-6d per Officer per hour or part thereof.

7. 'Disappointments'.—Where attendance is given by the proper officer but the applicant fails to act on his request, a minimum charge shall be made for such attendance as follows :—

- (i) on a working day 1 hour ;
- (ii) on a Sunday or Public Holiday 2 hours.

8. Transport.—Where the extra attendance of officers is required, applicants must provide transport where necessary, or defray the cost thereof.

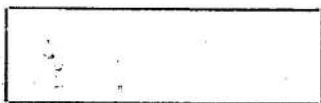

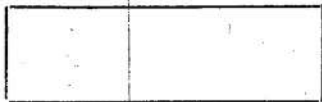
