CONSTITUTION OF THE FEDERATION

FEDERAL PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION (DELEGATION OF POWERS) NOTICE, 1963

In exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (1) of section 141 of the Constitution of the Federation and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Public Service Commission of the Federation, with the approval of the Prime Minister, hereby delegates to Permanent Secretaries and Heads of Extra Ministerial Departments in the Public Service of the Federation (hereinafter in this notice referred to as "Heads of Departments") the power specified in the Schedule hereto relating to discipline of officers in the Public Service of the Federation holding posts within the jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission of the Federation.

2. Heads of Departments shall, on each and every occasion the power is exercised, forthwith send a very brief report of the circumstances, the value of the loss and the names of the officers involved to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Finance, the Director of Audit and the Accountant-General of the Federation.

3. Herds of Departments shall not in turn, without the specific approval of the Public Service Commission of the Federation being first obtained, delegate the power.

4. Nothing in this delegation shall prevent the exercise of the power by the Public Service Commission of the Federation.

SCHEDULE

The power to impose surcharge on officers in respect of loss of stores or funds if the value of the loss on any one occasion does not exceed ten pounds and to ensure that the surcharge imposed is paid into the revenue of the Federal Government :

Provided that if the loss reveals a weakness in stores or accounting procedure, the power shall not be exercised until a full report in accordance with Financial Instructions has been rendered and which report shall include advice as to the action intended to be taken.
