By His Excellency the Right Honourable Doctor NNAMDI AZIKIWE, Member of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria.

NNAMDI AZIKIWE, Governor-General

Whereas by subsection (2) of section 115 of the Constitution of the Federation of Nigeria it is provided that the Judges of the High Court of Lagos shall be a Chief Justice of Lagos and such number of other Judges (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by Parliament.

AND WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (1) (as amended) of section 4 of the High Court of Lagos Act, Cap. 80 of the Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, that the number of Judges of the High Court of Lagos, in addition to the Chief Justice shall be eight.

AND WHEREAS the number of Judges of the High Court of Lagos is now six, in addition to the Chief Justice.

AND WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (2) of section 116 of the Constitution of the Federation that the Judges of the High Court of Lagos shall be appointed by the Governor-General acting in accordance with the advice of the Judicial Service Commission of the Federation.

Now Therefore, I, NNAMDI AZIKIWE, Member of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria, do hereby, in accordance with the advice of the Judicial Service Commission of the Federation appoint Joseph Adetunji Adefarasin to be an acting Judge of the High Court of Lagos with effect from the first day of June, 1963.
