NOTICE BY THE BOARD OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE NIGERIA

Customs and Excise Notice No. 3

PERMITS TO ENTER APPROVED WHARVES, CUSTOMS AREAS, AND EXAMINATION STATIONS AND TO BOARD SHIPS AND AIRCRAFT

Commencement : 1st August, 1963

Notes :

- 1. In this Notice the expression "Restricted Area" means an Approved Wharf, Customs Area or Examination Station.
 - 2. In this Notice "Collector" is to be interpreted as including "Preventive Superintendent".

PART I-INTRODUCTION

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Board of Customs and Excise by sections 13, 15, 18 and 67 of the Customs and Excise Management Act (No. 55 of 1958) it is hereby notified that the conditions under which persons are permitted to enter Restricted Areas and to board ships or aircraft are as stated herein.

PART II—PERMITS TO ENTER RESTRICTED AREAS

2. Entering Restricted Areas.—With the exception of the persons within the categories listed in sub-paragraphs (a) to (e) no person may enter any Restricted Area unless he is in possession of a valid permit issued by the appropriate issuing authority.

(a) Any officer of Customs and Excise on duty;

- (b) Very Important Persons (V.I.Ps.) and other persons approved by the Minister and using the special V.I.P. chalets or enclosures;
- (c) Any passenger who has a passage for a voyage, flight or journey in a ship, aircraft or vehicle. This exemption applies only to such Restricted Area which a passenger must enter to board or leave the ship, aircraft or vehicle in which he is to travel or has travelled.
- (d) Any person who satisfies the proper officer that he is the master, captain or driver, or a member of the crew, of a ship, aircraft or vehicle. This exemption applies only to such Restricted Area which such person must enter to reach or leave his ship, aircraft or vehicle by the most direct route.

(e) Any person whose services the proper officer is satisfied are urgently required in emergency for the safety or preservation of life or property.

3. Issuing Authorities.—In the schedule below, the proper issuing authority for permits to enter the Restricted Areas specified in Column I is the person holding the post designated in Column II, or any person authorised by him to act in his behalf.

Column I

- (a) Customs Areas managed by the Nigerian Ports Authority (but see Notes 1 and 2).
- (b) The Customs Area at Burutu (but see Notes 1 and 2).

(c) Customs Areas at Customs Airports :-

- (i) Arrival, Departure, Transit, and Baggage Halls.
- (ii) Customs Examination Stations (i.e., airport parking aprons)
- (d) All other Restricted Areas. (but see Notes 1 and 2).

Column II

The General Manager, Nigerian Ports Authority

The General Manager, Niger River Transport, Burutu.

(i) The Collector of Customs and Excise in charge of the airport.

(ii) The Airport Commandant, countersigned by the Collector of Customs and Excise in charge of the airport.

in charge of the airport.

The officer of Customs and Excise in charge of the port or place concerned.

Notes:

- (1) Permits issued under (a), (b) and (d) above do not allow the bearers to enter a Baggage Hall (or any other place which is for the time being in use as a place for examination of passengers' baggage), for which the issuing authority for permits is the Collector of Customs and Excise in charge of the port or place concerned.
- (2) A person in possession of a permit under Note 1 to enter a Baggage Hall is permitted to enter a Restricted Area without any other permit in order to proceed direct to and from the Baggage Hall. He is not permitted to board a ship or aircraft.

PART III-PERMITS TO BOARD SHIPS OR AIRCRAFT

- 4. With the exception of the persons within the categories listed in sub-paragraphs (a) to (d) below, no person may board any ship or aircraft unless he is in possession of a valid permit issued by the owner of the ship or aircraft concerned or by a person authorised by such owner to act on his behalf.
 - (a) Any officer of Customs and Excise on duty;

- (b) Any Government official wearing a uniform or in possession of an identity card and acting in the execution of his duty:
 - (c) The owner, master, officers and crew of the ship or aircraft concerned;
 - (d) Any passenger who has a passage in the ship or aircraft for its outward voyage or flight.

Notes :

- (1) A person in possession of a permit to board a ship or aircraft is permitted to enter a Restricted Area without any other permit in order to proceed direct to and from the ship or aircraft. He is not permitted to enter a Baggage Hall.
- (2) A person in possession of a permit to board a ship is not permitted to go on board until one hour after the ship has docked.

PART IV-APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

5. Except in special circumstances, every application for a permit must be made in writing to reach the appropriate issuing authority at least 48 hours before the time it is required to be used and the name(s) of the applicant(s) and the reason for which the permit is required must be stated.

PART V-Types of Permits and Persons to whom they are issued

- 6. Temporary Permits.—Temporary permits are valid only for the date(s) stated thereon. They will be issued to:—
 - (a) Persons, not more than 2, meeting or seeing off a passenger. These permits will normally not be issued for persons to enter Baggage Halls. Where they are issued for persons to board ships the limit will be 50 persons for any one ship.
 - (b) Persons having bona fide specific business to transact, e.g., persons clearing goods for themselves or agents duly authorised in accordance with Customs and Excise Notice No. 4. (Government Notice No. 694 of 1959).
 - (c) Parties organised for some special occasion, e.g., sightseeing visits, farewell or dinner parties. In these cases a block permit may be issued by special arrangement with the issuing authority, but the prior approval of the proper Collector of Customs and Excise must be obtained.
 - (d) In addition to any permits issued under (a) to (c) above, permits may be issued to :-
 - (i) Persons, normally not more than 3, meeting or seeing off a Very Important Person (V.I.P.);
 - (ii) Persons, normally not more than 2, meeting or seeing off an invalid who requires assistance;
 - (iii) One person only meeting or seeing off a child under the age of 12 years who is travelling unaccompanied or in the charge of a person who is not related to him;
 - (iv) One interpreter meeting or seeing off a passenger who cannot speak English.
- 7. Permanent Permits.—(a) Permanent permits are valid for a period not exceeding 12 months expiring on 30th June each year. Except where the Board otherwise directs, there shall be affixed to every permanent permit a photograph of the person to whom it is issued, the photograph to be supplied by that person.
 - (b) Permanent permits may be issued to:-
 - (i) Any person whose normal duty necessitates frequent visits to Restricted Areas. The permits are valid only when the holder is on duty;
 - (ii) Any person who, in the opinion of the Board, should possess a permanent permit.

PART VI-FORM OF PERMIT

8. No objection will be raised by the Board to the issue, by the authority concerned, of permits in the form of metal or plastic identification discs or cloth labels to persons employed on dock labour. In all other cases, permits will be in writing and in the form approved by the Board.

PART VII-CANCELLATION OF PERMITS

9. The Board reserves the right to cancel at any time, without assigning any reason therefor, any permit issued in accordance with this Notice.

EVENING COURSES, SESSION 1963-64

Re-enrolments.—The names of promoted and repeating students may be seen on the Technical Institute notice board. Students whose names are listed for re-enrolment should report to pay their fees between 8 a.m. and 2 p.m. or between 5.30 p.m. and 7 p.m. on September 4th to September 6th inclusive.

New Enrolments.—Applications are invited for enrolment to the following evening courses:

Courses Leading to the Ordinary Certificate Examination of C.G.L.I. in Building and Mechanical/Electrical Engineering

Selected applicants for these courses will be examined for entry to the preliminary stage. The subjects of study in the Junior course are: English, Mathematics, Science and Drawing. Entry to the Senior Courses is by successful completion of the Junior Course.

Course Leading to the Refrigeration Practice Examinations of C.G.L.I.

This, three-year course is based on the syllabus (No. 72) of the City and Guilds of London Institute examinations in Refrigeration Practice. Selected applicants will be examined for entry to the first

year which will include Refrigeration Science; Machinery and Plant, and Operation, Installation and Service.

Course Leading to R.S.A. Certificate Examinations in Stenography

Selected applicants will be examined for entry to the preliminary stage. A limited number of vacancies exist in the Senior stages for holders of R.S.A. certificates. This is a group course in English, Shorthand and Typewriting, but students of proved ability may proceed to higher stages in one or more subjects while continuing the remaining subject(s) at a lower level.

Course Leading to R.S.A. Certificate Examinations in Commercial Subjects

Selected applicants will be examined for entry to the preliminary stage, but applicants holding Class IV certificates will be considered for entry to the first year of the Senior Course, by competitive examination. Exemption from single subjects at appropriate levels will be given to enrolled students who hold Royal Society of Arts certificates in those subjects. This is a group course, and promotion within the course is only obtained by passing in (or being exempted from) all subjects of each stage. The preliminary year consists of English, Geography and Commercial Arithmetic, and in subsequent years the subjects are English, Geography, Book-keeping, Commerce and Economics.

Courses Leading to Intermediate Examinations of C.I.S., C.C.S. and C.C.A.

These three-year courses are open only to candidates who have passed (or have obtained exemption from) the preliminary examinations of the above professional organisations. Applicants should state which course they wish to follow. The subjects offered in the first year will be: Secretaryship—English, Accountancy, Economics and General Principles of English Law; and, for Accountancy—Book-keeping and Accountancy, Costing, Mercantile Law, Auditing and Business Statistics.

Method of application.-Applicants who are:

- (a) in possession of a Government Standard VI (or higher) certificate.
 - (b) not less than sixteen years of age.
- (c) preferable employed in work suited to their course of study and, (d) able to produce evidence of (a), (b), (c) and (d) when called upon to do so, may collect an Entrance Examination Application Form from the Technical Institute (Part Time Studies) office on July 22nd to 24th between 5.30 p.m. and 7 p.m. Application Forms will not be sent by post.

These forms must be completed and returned to the Technical Institute (Part Time Studies) not later than 5th August, 1963, and no further enquiry will be necessary. The numbers of candidates selected for examination will appear on the notice board after 17th August. Tuition Fees.—Preliminary Courses: £2-10s per session. Senior Courses: £4 per session. Students must supply their own stationery, text-books and instruments of a type and quality specified by the Institutes. External examination fees, where applicable, will be extra.
