*Explosives Regulations (Chapter 64)*

## ARRIVAL IN AND TRANSPORT FROM LAGOS OF HIGH EXPLOSIVES NOTICE

It is hereby notified for general information that, pursuant to regulation 63 (1) of the Explosives Regulations the Inspector of Mines has issued the following order:—

1. A minimum of 14 days' notice of the expected arrival of explosives in Lagos by sea stating the quantity of explosives involved, the intended method of evacuation from Lagos and the route to be followed and the destination of the explosives shall be given to the Commissioner of Police, Federal Territory, Lion Buildings, Campbell Street, Lagos, by an importer of explosives.

2. 24 hours notice of the confirmed date and time of arrival of explosives in Lagos must then be given to the Commissioner of Police, Federal Territory and, where quantities of one ton or more of high explosives are concerned, the time of its unloading at the Gaiser Wharf, Apapa, must also be notified by telephone to the Senior Superintendent of Police, C.I.D. Federal Territory, Lagos, Telephone No. Lagos 24946.

3. All high explosives being discharged from ships shall be off-loaded on to the railway or motor vehicles at the Gaiser Wharf, Apapa. If transportation is by road, the explosives shall be transported via the prescribed route set out in the Schedule hereunder. Transportation by railway will only be permitted at the Creek Road Feeder Line opposite Gaiser Wharf for the purpose of loading explosives to up country stations. Applications for waggons should be made to the Senior Traffic Officer, Apapa Local Station, Telephone No. 55236.

4. All motor vehicles carrying quantities of high explosives of one ton and over from the Gaiser Wharf unloading point shall be accompanied by a Police escort.

5. All movements of high explosives within the Lagos Municipality shall be notified at least 24 hours before-hand to the Commissioner of Police, Federal Territory, and the Town Engineer of the Lagos Town Council; if water transport is to be used, the Inland Waterways Department (Lagos Division), Ministry of Transport and Aviation, Lagos must also be informed. The notice must state the route, quantity and type(s) of explosives, its destination and the date and time the movement is to take place.

6. If explosives are to be transported from within the Lagos Municipal area to a place outside that area by boat or barge, the Inland Waterways Department (Lagos Division), Ministry of Transport and Aviation, the Government Inspector of Shipping, Ministry of Transport and Aviation, Lagos and the Commissioner of Police, Federal Territory, Lion Buildings, Campbell Street, Lagos, must be given at least 24 hours' notice of the movement. The information should state the quantity of explosives involved, the route to be taken and the destination of the explosives.

7. At all times during transportation of high explosives, the general provisions under the Explosives Regulations dealing with the handling and care of explosives shall be strictly observed.

8. This notice cancels Government Notice No. 316 which appeared in the *Federation of Nigeria Official Gazette* of the 23rd of February, 1961.
