- To require persons, in charge of registered dealers' armouries to employ watchman under Regulation 14 of the Firearms Regulations, 1959 and detail the hours of duty of such watchmen.
- To inspect business premises and reports of registered firearms dealers under Section 11 (4) of the Firearms Ordinance, 1958.
- To authorise the withdrawal of personal firearms and ammunition therefor from registered dealers' armouries under Regulation 17 (1) (a) of the Firearms Regulations, 1959.
- To authorise the withdrawal of personal firearms and ammunition therefor from public armouries under Regulation 20 (1) (a) of the Firearms Regulations, 1959.
