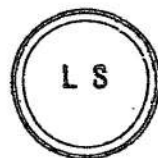

To issue permits for the withdrawal of firearms and the purchase and withdrawal of ammunition from an armoury under Regulation 5 (1) of the Firearms Regulations, 1959.

To require persons, in charge of registered dealers' armouries to employ watchman under Regulation 14 of the Firearms Regulations, 1959 and detail the hours of duty of such watchmen.

To inspect business premises and reports of registered firearms dealers under Section 11 (4) of the Firearms Ordinance, 1958.

To authorise the withdrawal of personal firearms and ammunition therefor from registered dealers' armouries under Regulation 17 (1) (a) of the Firearms Regulations, 1959.

To authorise the withdrawal of personal firearms and ammunition therefor from public armouries under Regulation 20 (1) (a) of the Firearms Regulations, 1959.

The Inspector-General of Police may at any time revoke the delegation of powers herein contained and on the publication of the notice of such revocation the delegation shall cease.

For purposes of collection of this tax, for which under the Western Region Produce Sales Tax Law, 1957 the Marketing Board is accountable to the appropriate regional authority in respect of all sales of cocoa made to it or to its licensed buying agents in the Region the arrangements as set out in paragraph 5 are prescribed.

5. The prices payable by the licensed buying agents of the Marketing Board for cocoa in the Western Region will take into account the incidence of produce sales tax and will accordingly be at the rates set out in columns IV and V of the schedule subjoined (being the minimum buying station prices fixed by the Marketing Board reduced by the amount of produce sales tax).
