Constitution of the Federation
Police Service Commission (Delegation of Powers) No. 2 Notice, 1963.

In exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (1) of section one hundred and ten of the Constitution of the Federation, the Police Service Commission of

the Federation, with the approval of the Prime Minister, hereby makes the following delegation—

- 1.—(1) This delegation may be cited as the Police Service Commission (Delegation of Powers) No. 2 Notice, 1963.
- (2) The provisions of this delegation, unless it is otherwise expressly provided or required by the context, shall apply in respect of members of the Nigeria Police Force below the rank of Assistant Superintendent and to posts in that Force in respect of which the initial basic salary does not exceed £726 per annum or such other sum as may at any time be the initial basic salary of a Chief Inspector.

#### 2.—(1) In this delegation—

"appointment" includes a temporary appointment and an appointment on probation, promotion, transfer or secondment, and includes the act of confirming any appointment;

"basic salary" means salary without contract addition or inducement allowance;

"initial basic salary" in relation to any post means the basic salary at the lowest point on the scale of salary applicable to such post.

- (2) The definitions contained in the Police Act shall apply to the construction of this delegation.
- 3.—(1) The Inspector-General may make appointments to any post to which this delegation applies subject to the condition that in respect of the post of Cadet Sub-Inspector the power shall be exercised with the prior approval of the Police Service Commission.
- (2) A Commissioner of Police may make appointments to the rank of Sergeant-Major and below.
- (3) A superior police officer of or above the rank of Senior Superintendent may make appointments to the rank of Constable and recruit Constable.
- 4.—(1) The Inspector-General may dismiss or terminate the appointment of any officer to whom this delegation applies subject to the condition that in respect of a Cadet Sub-Inspector the power shall be exercised with the prior approval of the Police Service Commission.
- (2) A superior police officer shall have such powers to dismiss police officers or terminate the appointment of such officers as are or hereafter may be conferred upon him by regulations made under the Police Act.
- 5.—(1) The Inspector-General may exercise any disciplinary control (except surcharge) in respect of any police officer to whom this delegation applies subject to the condition that in respect of the interdiction of an officer above the rank of Cadet Sub-Inspector the power shall be exercised with the prior approval of the Police Service Commission.
- (2) Subject to the like condition, a superior police officer, and an Inspector authorised in writing in that behalf by a superior police officer in charge of a police province, shall respectively have such powers of disciplinary control (except surcharge) over police officers as are or hereafter may be conferred upon them by regulations made under the Police Act.
- 6. The Inspector-General in respect of any police officer, and a Commissioner of Police in respect of any police officer of lower rank where the act or

default of a police officer results in the loss of government funds or the loss of or damage to government property, may respectively surcharge that police officer subject to the following conditions—

- (a) the amount of the loss or damage in any one case shall not have exceeded £10;
- (b) the amount of the surcharge shall be paid forthwith into the revenue of the Federal Government;
- (c) except where the surcharge is imposed in respect of damage to a government quarter or loss of or damage to any furniture belonging thereto or loss of or damage to personal kit, a written report shall, following the surcharge, be furnished by, or through, the Inspector-General to the Director of Audit of the Federation and the Accountant-General of the Federation indicating the name of the officer surcharged and the circumstances and the amount of the loss or damage;
- (d) where the loss or damage reveals a defect in the system of control of government funds or property, no surcharge shall be imposed until a written report containing recommendations for eliminating that defect has been furnished by, or through, the Inspector-General to the Police Service Commission, the Director of Audit of the Federation and the Accountant-General of the Federation.
- 7. Nothing in this delegation shall prevent the exercise by the Police Service Commission of any of the powers hereby delegated.
- 8. The Appointments and Discipline (Delegation) (Nigeria Police Force) Notice, 1959 (L.N. 123 of 1959) and the Police Service Commission (Delegation of Powers) Notice, 1963 (G.N. 1420 of 1963) are hereby revoked.

## OPENING TO THE PUBLIC OF THE YANKARI GAME RESERVE

Notice is hereby given that, as from 1st December, 1963 the Yankari Game Reserve, Bauchi Province, will be opened again to the general public for visits. The Game Reserve will be closed to visitors on the 31st day of May, 1964.

2: Visitors wishing to visit the Yankari Game Reserve must apply for permission to enter the Game Reserve, at least one month in advance of the date of their intended visit. Application should be made to the REGIONAL GAME WARDEN, MINISTRY OF ANIMAL AND FOREST RESOURCES, BAUCHI (Telegraphic address GAME BAUCHI) and should state whether the visitor will require the use of a Game Unit Land Rover within the Reserve.

- 3. Visitors to the Game Reserve are required to comply with any rules and Instruction for visitors issued by the Regional Game Warden.
- 4. The Yankari Game Reserve is an area of approximately 720 square miles in extent situated in the Bauchi Province and to the south-east of Bauchi.

Access to the Game Reserve from Bauchi is by means of the Bauchi-Gombe all season (laterite) motor road from DINDIMA. Dindima is approximately 24 miles from Bauchi on this road. From Dindima the road is a dry season laterite road to MAINA MAJI BASE CAMP (18 miles) on the north-western corner of the Game Reserve.

- 5. Visitors are expected to use their own transport as far as the Maina Maji Base camp. Thereafter they may proceed to the Wikki Warm Springs camp either in their own transport or if they wish, by Game Unit landrover.
- 6. Visitors are required to proceed on excursions from Wikki Warm Springs camp in landrovers provided by the Game Unit and are not permitted to use their own vehicles (landrovers excepted) for this purpose.
- 7. Accommodation within the Game Reserve.— Visitors are warned that there is no catering rest house accommodation in the Game Reserve. Tents are provided, ready erected, at the Wikki Warm Springs camp within the Game Reserve. Visitors must therefore bring with them full camping loads and must provide their own beds, bedding, food, drink, cooking and lighting facilities. Wood and water is provided but no servants are provided.

- 8. It is hoped, when funds become available, to improve the facilities but, for the present, visitors must be prepared to travel self-contained and camp self-contained under canvas in the Wikki Warm Springs camp.
- 9. To have a reasonable certainty of seeing a representative selection of the Wild animals found within the Game Reserve it is essential that at least one night be spent in the Reserve.
- 10. The normal procedure for visits is for the visitor to leave Bauchi (where there is a catering rest house) in the morning in order to arrive at the Base Camp before mid-day. In the Base Camp the visitor will be met by a member of the Game Protection Staff and conducted to the Wikki Warm Springs Camp.
- 11. It is recommended that visitors bring a picnic lunch with them from Bauchi to be eaten *en route* to the Wikki Warm Springs Camp.
- 12. On arrival at the Wikki Warm Springs Camp the visitor will find tents ready erected and rough camp cooking facilities in the form of a rumfa and fire place. No cooking utensils are provided.
- 13. In the evening of arrival the visitor is taken on a tour in the Game Land Rover (or his own Land Rover) by a member of the Game Protection Staff and shown the areas where game congregate.
- 14. A similar tour is arranged before breakfast on the next day to a different part of the Game Reserve. Mornings and evenings are the best times for seeing the Wild animals in the Reserve.
- .15. Charges.—The following charges are payable by visitors to the Game Reserve:—
  - (1) Transport Charges.—(a) A charge of ten shillings per person is payable in respect of the transport from the Base Camp to the Wikki Warm Springs when a Game Unit Land Rover is used.
  - (b) A charge of ten shillings per person is payable in respect of the transport within the reserve for each "round trip" for viewing the animals. A "round trip" consists of one evening and one morning tour.
  - (c) Transport from Wikki Warm Springs to the Base Camp on leaving the Game Reserve is free.
  - (2) A charge of 5s per night per person is payable for the provision of tents, wood and water at the Wikki Warm Springs Camp.

Children under the age of sixteen years are not liable for the above charges.

All charges are payable before leaving the Game Reserve.

Children below the age of twelve years are not permitted to enter the Game Reserve in the interest of safety.

The following animals inhabit the Game Reserve and a visitor can normally expect to see a fair selection:

Rules governing Visitors to the Yankari Game Reserve

- 1. No visitor may bring any firearm into the Game Reserve.
- 2. Any visitor having in his possession on arrival at the Game Reserve any firearm is required to hand the same to the Regional Game Warden, or Game Guard in charge of the party for safe-keeping during the time that the visitor is within the Game Reserve.
- 3. Except within the immediate environs of the Wikki Warm Springs camp visitors are not permitted to move about the Game Reserve except under the guidance, and in the company of the Regional Game Warden or Game Guard in charge of the party.
- 4. No visitor may dismount from the Land rover when moving through the Game Reserve except with the permission of the Regional Game Warden or Game Guard in charge of the party.
- No fires may be lit, except at the Wikki Warm Springs Camp.
- 6. Visitors are forbidden to drive, harass or deliberately startle the game.
- 7. Visitors are reminded that the game is wild, and that some species, e.g. Bush Cow (Buffalo) are potentially dangerous to human life.
- 8. Visitors entering the Game Reserve do so entirely at their own risk and that Government of Northern Nigeria cannot be held liable for any damage, injury or loss, either to the visitors themselves or their property.
