The balance of £30,000 we understand can no longer be released in the face of government austerity. The excess of £40,836-6s-2d and any future expenditure must therefore be financed from internal sources.

(5) Item 37 (3) Victoria Island Phase I, site development includes the purchase, transhipment, erection and maintenance of the Bailey Bridge used temporarily to span the Five-Cowries Creek. This Bailey Bridge was subsequently re-purchased by the Federal Ministry of Works for a nominal sum of £20,000.

CUSTOMS AND EXCISE TARIFF—RE-CLASSIFIED ON THE BASIS OF THE BRUSSELS NOMENCLATURE

Commencement Date of Trial Period : 1st March, 1964

The Customs and Excise Tariff has been transposed. Considerable re-arrangement has been effected in respect of all Schedules and the main Import section has been re-classified according to the Brussels Tariff Nomenclature. All items—Import and Export (with the exception of conditional Import Exemptions)—have also been classified according to the Import and Export List, and alphabetically-arranged commodity indexes have been included.

2. It is appreciated that, initially, the new Tariff will be an unfamiliar document and, in order to allow time for officials and members of the public to become thoroughly acquainted with the new classifications, it will be introduced initially for a trial period of approximately three months. During the trial period, the existing Customs Tariff Act, together with the existing Duty Schedules, will continue in force and there will be no change in the current procedure for Customs Entries.

3. As from 1st March, 1964 when the trial period begins, Importers and Exporters are invited to present an *additional* copy of every Entry, classified according to the new Tariff. This copy, which is for the purpose of practice only, will be retained for checking in the Long Room. Unless errors are found, or a query is raised, no further action will follow. If, however, the classifications shown are considered to be incorrect, the entry will be referred back to the proprietor who presented it. During the trial period, no penalties of any kind will be imposed for errors on the *additional* copies of entry presented in respect of the new Tariff.

4. All proprietors are earnestly requested to co-operate in this exercise in order that the legal enforcement of the new Tariff—at the end of the trial period—may be effected smoothly and without avoidable delay to documents or clearance of goods.

5. Copies of the new Tariff are on sale at the following Custom Houses—Apapa, Lagos, Port Harcourt, Sapele, and Kano and may be purchased from—the Chief Accountant, Department of Customs and Excise, 61 Broad Street, Lagos.
