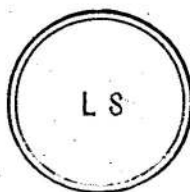

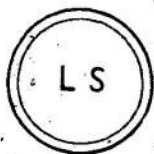

Duties:—(a) *Agronomy.*—The Agronomy Division of this Institute investigates into methods of planting and cultivating the oil palm. This work includes investigations into fertilizer needs, control of undergrowth by herbicides, the combination of planting oil palm with annual crops of stock-rearing, mechanisation of field operations and the replanting of plantations and palm grove areas.

(b) *Statistics.*—The Statistics Division at this Institute is responsible for giving advice to other research divisions on the design and interpretation of their experiments. The division operates Punched-Card Equipment for the computing of annual yields from field experiments, and is also responsible for meteorological records being maintained at the Institute.

(c) *Soil Chemistry.*—The Soil Chemistry Division is engaged in investigating the nutrient status for oil palm cultivation of the various soils in West Africa which support palm groves or are likely to be used for plantation development.

(d) *Plant Breeding.*—The Plant Breeding Division is required to carry out the Institute's long-term breeding programme and to investigate the inheritance factor of economic importance in the production of palm products. The programme also includes special botanical studies on the flowering of the oil palm and genetical studies of the inheritance of fruit characters.

(e) *Plant Physiology.*—The Plant Physiology Division is concerned with investigating the physiology of the growth and flowering of the oil palm. The present work includes growth analysis studies and

investigations connected with germination, but increasing attention is being given to the physiology of flowering and bunch production in the adult palm.

(f) *Plant Physiology (Nutrition)*.—The Plant Nutrition Division is engaged in investigating the nutrition of the seedling palm in pot culture to assist in determining deficiency symptoms and in solving problems of fertiliser balance. It also undertakes leaf analysis on a large scale, with a view to determining fertiliser needs. The division is equipped with a specially built glasshouse suitable for tropical use.

(g) *Plant Physiology (Palm-Wine Production)*.—The Palm-wine Production Division is concerned with the physiology of palm-wine production as distinct from palm-wine tapping.

(h) *Plant Pathology*.—The Plant Pathology Division is engaged in investigating a number of diseases of the oil palm occurring in nurseries and in adult plantations. Certain diseases are prevalent only in certain soils or certain oil palm progenies and the division works in close co-operation with the Plant Breeding and Soil Chemistry Divisions.

(i) *Research Engineering*.—The Research Engineering Division develops milling processes for the extraction of palm oil and kernels both in large mills and with equipment suitable for village use. The division also studies factors affecting the quality of palm oil, particularly its bleachability.

Qualifications.—(a) *Agronomy*.—Degree in natural sciences plus field experimentation with crops in the tropics and two years post-graduate training or research.
