WHEREAS by subsection (2) of section 111 of the Constitution of the Federation it is provided that the Judges of the Supreme Court shall be:— (a) the Chief Justice of Nigeria; and (b) any such number of Justices of the Supreme Court (not being less than five) as may be prescribed by Parliament:

AND WHEREAS by the Justices of the Supreme Court Act, 1964, Parliament has prescribed that the number of Justices of the Supreme Court shall be eight:

AND WHEREAS by subsection (1) of section 112 of the Constitution of the Federation it is provided that four of the Justices of the Supreme Court shall be appointed by the President acting on the advice, as respects each of those Justices severally, of the Premier of a different Region:

NOW THEREFORE, I, NNAMDI AZIKIWE, President and Commander-in-Chief of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, do hereby, in accordance with the advice of the Premier of Mid-Western Nigeria, appoint CHIKE IDIGBE, Esq. to be a Justice of the Supreme Court with effect from the 9th day of April, 1964.

AND WHEREAS by subsection (1) of section 112 of the Constitution of the Federation it is provided that four of the Justices of the Supreme Court shall be appointed by the President acting on the advice, as respects each of those Justices severally, of the Premier of a different Region:

NOW THEREFORE, I, NNAMDI AZIKIWE, President and Commander-in-Chief of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, do hereby, in accordance with the advice of the Premier of Eastern Nigeria, appoint MICHAEL OGUTJIOFO AJEGBO, Esq. to be a Justice of the Supreme Court with effect from the 9th day of April, 1964.

Applications are invited for Federal Government Scholarship Awards for undergraduate studies and for technical training. The purpose of these scholarships is to enable young Nigerians with appropriate qualifications to acquire the knowledge and skills required to occupy vital posts in the Public Service and in the economy of the Federation.

3. The number of awards to be made in each field of study or training will be determined in the light of the anticipated needs of the Federal Public Service, the Federal Statutory Corporations and the general economic development of Nigeria as determined by the National Manpower Board.

4. The majority of these awards are open to candidates from all parts of the Federation, but a certain number will be reserved for candidates from Northern Nigeria, Niger Delta Special Area and the Federal Territory of Lagos. Candidates, who are eligible and intend to apply for the latter awards at a later date, are free to apply for the open awards as well.

5. *Value of awards.*—Candidates should not assume that scholarships will cover all costs of study or training, though in all cases they will cover tuition fees. The value of awards will be as follows:—

(a) Nigerian Universities and Institutions of higher learning	£160 p.a.
(b) United Kingdom and Europe	£360 p.a.
(c) America and Canada	£576 p.a.

6. Candidates are advised to acquaint themselves with the conditions of admission to the Courses of study or training they wish to take up and ensure that they hold necessary academic qualifications. The following points should be noted:—

(a) *For University Degree Courses.*—The qualifications required are the General Certificate of Education at Advanced Level or the Higher School Certificate at Principal Level in subjects appropriate to the intended course of study, in addition to evidence of a general education to the level of the West African School Certificate, Grade II or its equivalent;

(b) *For Non-University Courses.*—West African School Certificate or an equivalent qualification obtained through the General Certificate of Education at Ordinary Level or officially recognised examinations in subjects related to the proposed course of study.

7. Candidates wishing to study subjects available in Nigeria and West African Institutions of higher learning and training should, in addition to submitting their scholarship applications, apply for admission direct to the Institutions of their choice. Candidates will be required to produce evidence of admission before their applications for scholarships are finally considered but no assurance of an award can be given to every applicant who has obtained entry to an Institution of learning.

8. In those cases where it appears to the Federal Scholarships' Advisory Board that places for courses of study or training are not available in Nigeria or West Africa, arrangements will, at the Board's discretion, be made to place successful candidates in Overseas Institutions. This will be done primarily by the utilisation of scholarship offers from Foreign Governments and Institutions, and from International Organisations. However, applicants for courses marked "OVERSEAS" in paragraph 2 above are also advised to apply for provisional admission to Institutions of their choice through the Students Advisory Committee of the Federal Ministry of Education.

9. The particular attention of candidates who wish to apply from abroad is drawn to paragraph 2 above. They will not be awarded scholarships tenable abroad, if study or training in their chosen fields can be pursued in West Africa. Such candidates are therefore advised to apply promptly for admission to Nigerian Institutions of higher learning. If offered a scholarship tenable in West Africa, they will be required to return to Africa at their own expense.

10. *Other Qualifications required:—*

(a) Applications for scholarships may be submitted by candidates of either sex who are Nigerian citizens and who are under 30 years of age on 1st January, 1964.

(b) Successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination of fitness which will include a tuberculin test and an X-ray examination of the chest.

TRAINING OF NIGERIANS AS
COMMERCIAL PILOTS

The Federal Government invites applications from suitably qualified young men to train as commercial pilots and to take their place in Nigeria's developing civil aviation. To be eligible for training under this scheme, candidates must be aged between 17 and 25 years, unmarried, and hold the West African School Certificate (or equivalent), with credits in English Language and Mathematics; candidates with higher educational qualifications will receive preference. A high standard of physical fitness is essential.

2. An initial training course of about six months' duration will be held at the Flying School near Lagos, during which successful candidates will be paid a salary or allowances of £28 per month and provided with uniform and flying clothing.

3. On completion of the initial training course, successful candidates may qualify for the Private Pilot's Licence, and the more outstanding pupils may be selected for further training overseas, the successful completion of which would make them eligible for the Commercial Pilot's Licence. During this advanced training the Federal Government's scholarships rates will be paid, together with all the usual allowances.

4. Successful candidates returning to Nigeria with Commercial Licences may be offered appointment with Nigeria Airways, but there may also be opportunities for employment in the Northern Region Communications Flight, and with Nigerian non-scheduled operators. Holders of commercial Licences appointed to Nigeria Airways would begin their careers as Second Officers, and with experience, would be required to gain higher qualifications, making them eligible for promotion, ultimately to the responsibility of having their own command. Somewhat similar arrangements would apply to those taking up other air crew appointments.

5. Candidates holding the requisite educational qualifications should apply immediately by letter, addressed to the Chief Flying Instructor, Federal Ministry of Transport, Private Mail Bag 12518, Lagos, giving the following information only:—

General Art.—This two-year course is open to candidates with West African School Certificate, General Certificate of Education (O) level, or Teacher's Grade II Certificate, and leads to the award of the Yaba Diploma in General Art, an equivalent of an intermediate degree in Fine Art.

Commercial Art.—A two-year course open to candidates of good general education and high artistic ability, designed for studio assistants in advertising and similar concerns.

There are also specialised courses in Pottery and Sculpture.

Printing.—A three-year course open to applicants of not less than 18 years of age who hold a Government Secondary IV Certificate. Prefe-

rence may be given to those with some experience in one of the branches of the Printing Industry, but previous experience is not essential.

Stenography.—This course is open to holders of Government Secondary Modern II Certificate or equivalent. Previous knowledge of, or experience in, shorthand and typewriting is not essential, and there is no upper limit to the proficiency which students may attain, subject to their own progress and aptitude.
