In exercise of the powers conferred by the Education (Lagos) Ordinance, 1957, the Minister of Education has authorised that Mr E. J. Moses, Chief Education Officer, shall carry out the registration of children on the 24th, 25th and 26th of August, 1964.

Parents are advised that children who do not satisfy these conditions cannot be offered places in a maintained primary school.

4. It is further required that each child shall be accompanied to the registration centre by one or other parent or by a legal guardian, and that satisfactory evidence of the child's age shall be produced. A birth certificate in the official form is preferred to any other evidence.

5. Registration Officers shall be empowered to reject any child who may appear to be younger or older than the specified age.

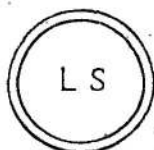

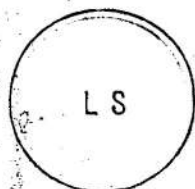
