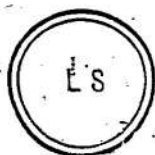

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION, WESTERN NIGERIA  
OPENING OF SECONDARY GRAMMAR  
SCHOOLS

It is notified for general information that the aim of Government is to see that ten per cent (10%) of primary school leavers go to secondary grammar schools. This target is expected to be reached rather by expansion of the existing schools into double and treble streams than by the mushroom opening of new schools. Schools are encouraged to open only in areas where they are educationally desirable.

2. Before a new secondary grammar school is allowed to open, therefore, the following conditions, and others which may be laid down from time to time, must be fulfilled:—

(i) *Method of application.*—Applications must be submitted on the prescribed Form W.R. Ed. 14 direct to this Ministry not later than the 1st day of July of the year preceeding that in which it is proposed to establish the institution. A school normally opens at the beginning of the school year, i.e., in January.

(ii) *Site.*—The Proprietor must have a valid title to the land and the site must be approved by the Medical Officer of Health in the area, or his



representative. The following minimum site areas are required to allow for full development ;

Day Schools .. .. .	{ Boys—15 acres
	{ Girls—12 acres
Boarding Schools .. .. .	{ Boys—40 acres
	{ Girls—25 acres

(iii) *Staff*.—(a) A graduate Principal must be immediately available without depriving any existing institution of essential staff. He/She must possess a teaching qualification and must have had at least 4 years post-graduate teaching experience in a secondary grammar school or teacher training college. If he/she has no teaching qualification, he/she must have had at least 6 years post-graduate teaching experience.

(b) There must be other qualified supporting staff.

(c) In the case of a co-educational institution, a qualified female teacher must be available.

(d) The legal minimum number of graduates is one to every 90 pupils or part thereof, but it is not possible to conduct a school certificate course satisfactorily with less than 4 graduates. Thus, arrangements for the supply of graduate staff must be in hand from the outset by sponsoring students in training to ensure that a second graduate will be available at the beginning of the fourth year of the school's existence and another in the fifth year, if the school is a single stream.

(e) The staff quota is  $1\frac{1}{2}$  to a class and there is no maximum as to the number of graduates to be on the staff of a school.

(iv) *Finance*.—Sufficient capital must be immediately available to erect and equip the minimum initial buildings for the school in permanent materials. Four classrooms and necessary latrines and ablutions constitute absolute minimum initial accommodation whose present cost is estimated at £4,000. A complete boarding school cannot be built in permanent materials for less than £30,000. This Ministry may demand evidence that this amount is available. Promoters or Proprietors of a new institution should be able to carry on the running of the school, including the cost of buildings, maintenance and staff salaries, *without asking for Government assistance for at least 7 years*.

(v) *Buildings*.—All buildings must be constructed in permanent materials in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Medical Officer of Health in the area, a qualified Engineer or Architect, the Local Town Planning Authority and this Ministry.

4. It is emphasized that, even when all the conditions specified above have been fulfilled, the approval of the Honourable Minister of Education cannot be anticipated since the application has to be considered on its own merit and in relation to the overall educational policy of the Government.

4. Special attention is drawn to the provisions of subsection (1A) of Section 39 of the Education Law which stipulates that it is an offence to conduct or advertise an intention to conduct an entrance examination or invite prospective candidates to apply

for admission to a new institution, the opening of which has not received the consent of the Minister.

#### DESCRIPTION OF FULL TIME COLLEGE COURSES

The following courses will be offered on a full time basis during session 1964-65.

*Engineering and Building (Higher)*.—A two-year course open only to those having one of the following qualifications :

(a) a final Ordinary Certificate of C.G.I.I. in Mechanical or Electrical Engineering or Building as appropriate, or

(b) an appropriate Diploma of the Yaba College of Technology, or of the former Yaba Technical Institute, or

(c) a pass in the Joint Part I examinations of the Engineering Institutions.

All applicants must have a minimum of one year of approved practical experience.

(a) a Secondary Technical Certificate of the Yaba College of Technology, or a Junior Technical Certificate of the former Yaba Technical Institute, or

(b) a West African School Certificate with four credits ; in English, Mathematics, Physics (or Physics-with Chemistry) and one other suitable subject, or

(c) a General Certificate of Education with passes at Ordinary level in four subjects as listed in (b) above.

Successful completion of the course entitles the student to the award of the Yaba Diploma, and to entry to the Ordinary Certificate examinations of C.G.I.I. Applicants must state a preference for Mechanical Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Civil Engineering or Building.

*General Art*.—This two-year course is open to candidates with West African School Certificate, General Certificate of Education (O) level, or Teacher's Grade II Certificate, and leads to the award of the Yaba Diploma in General Art, an equivalent of an intermediate degree in Fine Art.

**Commercial Art.**—A two-year course open to candidates of good general education and high artistic ability, designed for studio assistants in advertising and similar concerns.

There are also specialized courses in Pottery and Sculpture.

**Printing.**—A three-year course open to applicants of not less than 18 years of age who hold a Government Secondary IV Certificate. Preference may be given to those with some experience in one of the branches of the Printing Industry, but previous experience is not essential.

**Stenography.**—This course is open to holders of Government Secondary Modern II Certificate or equivalent. Previous knowledge of, or experience in, shorthand and typewriting is not essential, and there is no upper limit to the proficiency which students may attain, subject to their own progress and aptitude.
