

AND WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (1) (as amended) of section 4 of the High Court of Lagos Act, Cap. 80 of the Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, that the number of Judges of the High Court of Lagos, in addition to the Chief Justice shall be eight.

AND WHEREAS the number of Judges of the High Court of Lagos, in addition to the Chief Justice is now seven.

Now therefore, I, NNAMDI AZIKIWF, President and Commander-in-Chief of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by subsection 4 of section 123 of the Constitution of the Federation of Nigeria, do hereby, appoint Basil Agrolade Adedipte to act in the office of a Judge of the High Court of Lagos with effect from the 1st day of June, 1964.
