(a) To carry on business as manufacturers in Nigeria of glue, paints and plastic goods and as buyers, sellers, importers, exporters and distributors of glue, paints and plastic goods and generally to do all or anything pertaining to the making of and selling glue, paints, and plastic goods.

(b) To carry on business as manufacturers, buyers, sellers, importers, exporters and distributors of motor vehicle spare parts and accessories.

(c) To carry on business as general merchants.

(d) To carry on business as produce buyers and agents and to deal generally in produce.

(e) To provide technical service for the maintenance, repair and assembly of motor vehicles ; and other objects set forth in the memorandum of association thereof.

5. Your petitioner is the holder for valuable consideration of a bill of exchange dated the 1st day of August, 1961 for the sum of £990-4s-2d (Nine hundred and ninety pounds four shillings and two pence) payable at 180 days sight, drawn by Deutsche Westafrikanische Handelsgesellschaft, Hamburg, West Germany, upon and accepted by the Company and indorsed by divers persons. The said bill was dishonoured at maturity.

6. On or about the 21st day of May, 1964, your petitioner duly commenced and prosecuted an action in the High Court of Lagos as Suit No. LD/205/64 against the Company for the recovery of the amount of the said bill and interest.

7. The Company failed to appear to the writ in the said action, and your petitioner on the 1st day of September, 1964, recovered judgment in the said action against the Company for the sum of £1,039-14s-2d being principal together with interest thereon and £63 costs making a total sum of £1,102-14s-2d recovered by the said judgment.

8. Your petitioner on the 22nd day of September, 1964, sued out a writ of *fieri facias* under the said judgment but on the 23rd October, 1964, the Sheriff of Lagos to whom the said writ was directed, returned the same wholly unsatisfied, the Company having no goods or chattels within his bailiwick upon which execution could be levied.

To mitigate this delay in future, and in order to cater for good services, it will be necessary for Consignees to advise Consignors when ordering goods, to forward all shipping documents by airmail direct to the Government Coastal Agent, Government Coastal Agency, Apapa, immediately after the carrying ships have sailed so that documents will arrive at least 5-7 days before the vessels.

HOME DELIVERY AND OTHER SECOND-HAND ROAD MOTOR VEHICLES

General.—(a) The use of Customs Form C. 114—Declaration in respect of Motor Vehicle Imported for the First Time—for clearance of home delivery and other second-hand motor vehicles imported for the first time, whether accompanying a passenger or not, was discontinued on the 1st of July, 1964.

(b) As from that date (1st July, 1964):—

(i) all importations of home delivery and other second-hand motor vehicles other than those driven overland by the user are entered and cleared on import entries; and

(ii) all importations overland are cleared on Form Sale 46—Declaration of Motor Vehicle Imported Overland—a specimen is annex to this notice.

2. *Invoices.*—Invoices, required for ascertaining the basic retail price of the vehicle in the country of origin and the date of purchase, are to be attached to the relevant import entry or Form Sale 46.

3. *Value—Basic retail price.*—The basic retail price is the ex-shop price of vehicle in the country of origin excluding:—

(a) pre-shipment freight or transport and pre-shipment insurance charges;

(b) local duties and taxes or fees in the country of origin and any charge incurred in obtaining bond or cover for such duty, taxes or fees;

(c) cost of registration plates purchased abroad.

4. *Value for duty.*—The value for duty is the basic retail price less the deductions in paragraphs 5 and 6 plus the charges in paragraph 7. The proper officer may require the importer to produce documentary evidence to substantiate the declaration in respect of any of the items.

5. *Deductions from basic retail price.*—The following deductions are allowed for age provided the importer or his agent submits, with the relevant entry or Form Sale 46, satisfactory documentary evidence to show that the vehicle had previously been licensed and used abroad:—

(a) if used abroad for not more than one year 15% of the basic retail price;

(b) if used abroad for over one year but not exceeding two years .. 20% of the basic retail price;

(c) for every additional year of use after two years, up to a maximum of 9 years 10% of the basic retail price. (additional to (b));

(d) for vehicles used abroad for over 9 years, see paragraph 8.

6. In effect, deductions from the basic retail price are for:—

not more than 1 year 15%

not more than 2 years 20%

not more than 3 years 30%

not more than 4 years 40%

not more than 5 years 50%

and so on, up to 9 years.
