For some time now, shipments from the Continents have been on the increase and in most cases. Consignors of goods forward shipping documents direct to Consignees who in turn hold these documents in custody for a considerable time. They would not forward them except on demand by the Government Coastal Agent and this after the vessels had arrived an'd discharged.

- 2. This procedure, no doubt, causes a lot of delay in clearance and as a result heavy ports' penal rents are incurred.
- 3. You are all well aware that shipping documents must be processed through the Customs and the Nigerian Ports Authority well in advance before the arrival of ships in order to be able to effect early clearance of goods and thereby avoid payment of storage rents.
- 4. To mitigate this delay in future, and in order to cater for good services, it will be necessary for Consignees to advise Consignors when ordering goods, to forward all shipping documents by airmail direct to the Government Coastal Agent, Government Coastal Agency, Apapas immediately after the carrying ships have sailed so that documents will arrive at least 5-7 days before the vessels.

 - (b) local duties and taxes or fees in the country of origin and any charge incurred in obtaining bond or cover for such duty, taxes or fees;
 - (c) cost of registration plates purchased abroad.
- 4. Value for duty.—The value for duty is the basic retail price less the deductions in paragraphs 5 and 6 plus the charges in paragraph 7. The proper officer may require the importer to produce documentary evidence to substantiate the declaration in respect of any of the items.
- 5. Deductions from basic retail price.—The following deductions are allowed for age provided the importer or his agent submits, with the relevant entry or Form Sale 46, satisfactory documentary evidence to show that the vehicle had previously been licensed and used abroad:—
 - (a) if used abroad for not more than one year 15% of the basic retail price;
 - (b) if used abroad for over one year but not exceeding two years .. 20% of the basic retail price:
 - (c) for every additional year of use after two years, up to a maximum of 9 years
 - 10% of the basic retail price. (additional to (b));
 - (d) for vehicles used abroad for over 9 years, see paragraph 8.
- 7. Charges to be added to the net value.—The following charges are to be added to the net value resulting from the deductions in paragraphs 5 and 6, to arrive at the value for duty:—
 - (a) Ocean freight;
 - (b) Marine Insurance;
 - (c) Incidental Charges during and after shipment;
 - (d) Cost of all additional fittings, replacements and renovations:
 - (e) Buying Commission of not less than 4%, as laid down in Customs and Excise Notice No. 13 (Government Notice No. 702 of 1959).
- 8. Value of Vehicles bought new and used abroad for over 9 years, and Vehicles bought second-hand abroad.—
 Where a vehicle was bought new but has been used abroad for over 9 years, or a vehicle was bought second-hand abroad, the value for duty will be appraised. In such cases all documents which may be of assistance in determining the value of the vehicle are to be submitted to the proper officer.
