- (i) English Literature, History, Geography.
- (ii) English Literature, History, French.
- (iii) French, History, Geography.
- (iv) Geography, Pure Maths., Applied Maths.
- (v) English Literature, History, Art.
- (vi) English Literature, French, Geography.

5. The Entrance Examination for the H.S.C. Course will be held on WEDNESDAY, THURSDAY and FRIDAY the 19th, 20th and 21st of May, 1965.

6. All candidates will be required to take the English Language Paper and, in addition, a paper in each of the subjects which they propose to offer for the Higher School Certificate Course. Those candidates who wish to take a course in Botany and/or Zoology are required to sit for the Biology Paper, and those for Pure Mathematics and/or Applied Mathematics to sit for the Elementary and Additional Mathematics Papers.

7. Candidates who wish to take Physics, Pure Mathematics, or Applied Mathematics in the Higher School Certificate Course here are required to have offered Elementary, and Additional Mathematics for the School Certificate Examination.

N.B.

In the Additional Mathematics Paper, candidates will be examined only in the compulsory part of the Additional Mathematics syllabus, i.e., Section A, plus indices, logarithms, surds, A.P., G.P., and the Remainder Theorem. There will be a wide choice of questions.

8. The School Certificate Examination General Science Course is not considered an adequate background for candidates who wish to take Physics, Chemistry, Botany or Zoology in the H.S.C. Examinations, and will not be so accepted.

(d) Other candidates who show sufficient reason why they have not already obtained Advanced Level qualifications and who satisfy the Board of the Faculty of Science by examination or other test of their ability to pursue and profit by the Preliminary Course.


