The successful completion of one of these courses entitles the student to the award of the Yaba Diploma, and to entry to the Ordinary Technicians Diploma examinations of C.G.L.I.

Laboratory Technicians.—A two-year course leading to the Science Laboratory Technician's Examinations of C.G.L.I. Applicants should possess a West African School Certificate with credits in Mathematics and two Science subjects, but consideration may be given to holders of a Government Secondary IV Certificate who can show evidence of adequate practical laboratory experience. Success in this course entitles the student to the award of a Certificate.

Art.—Two and three-year courses open to candidates of not less than 18 years of age who hold a West African School Certificate and can show evidence of artistic aptitude. In exceptional cases candidates of lower qualifications may be considered.

General Art.—A two-year intermediate level course in the various departments of Fine and Commercial Arts and Crafts.

Commercial Art.—A two-year concentrated course designed to produce Studio Assistants for advertising and similar trades.

Fashion Design.—A three-year course in Dress Design and Fashion Illustration.

Accountancy and Secretaryship.—Separate two-year courses open only to those who have passed the preliminary examinations of A.C.C.A., C.C.S. or C.I.S., or who have been granted exemption therefrom by the relevant Association.

Applicants must signify which of these three Associations' curricula they wish to follow. At present, the courses extend only to the intermediate level of the professional bodies' examinations. The College Diploma in Accountancy or Secretaryship, as appropriate, will be awarded on successful completion of the course.

Stenography.—This course is open, at two levels, to holders of Secondary Modern II Certificates and West African School Certificates. Previous knowledge of experience in Shorthand and Typewriting is not essential, and there is no upper limit to the proficiency which students may attain subject to their own progress. The examination syllabuses of R.S.A. are followed. A Certificate in Stenography is awarded on successful completion of the course.

Instrument Technicians.—A two-year course leading to the Industrial Measurement and Control Technician's Certificate examinations of C.G.L.I.

Applicants should possess a West African School Certificate with credits in Mathematics and a suitable Science subject together with a pass in English Language.

Majority of the above courses are tenable in Nigerian Universities.

3. The number of awards to be made in each field of study or training will be determined in the light of the anticipated needs of the Federal Public Service, the Federal Statutory Corporations and the general economic development of Nigeria as determined by the National Manpower Board.

4. *Value of Awards.*—Scholarships will not cover all costs of study or training, though in all cases they will cover tuition fees. The value of awards will be as follows :—

5. Candidates are advised to acquaint themselves with the conditions of admission to courses of study or training they wish to undertake and ensure that they hold the necessary academic qualifications. The following points should be noted :—

(a) *For University Degree Courses.*—The qualifications required are the General Certificate of Education at Advanced Level or the Higher School Certificate at Principal Level in subjects appropriate to the intended course of study, in addition to evidence of a general education to the level of the West African School Certificate, Grade II or its equivalent ;

(b) *For Non-University Degree Courses.*—West African School Certificate or equivalent qualifications obtained through the General Certificate of Education at Ordinary Level or officially recognised examinations in subjects related to the proposed course of study.

6. In addition to submitting scholarship applications, all candidates are required to apply for admission direct to the Institutions of their choice especially candidates wishing to study subjects available in Nigeria and West African Institutions of higher learning and training. Candidates will be required to produce evidence of admission before their applications for scholarships are finally considered but no assurance of an award can be given to every applicant who has obtained entry to an Institution of higher learning.

7. In the cases where courses of study or training are not available in Nigeria or West Africa, arrangements will be made at the Board's discretion, to place successful candidates in Overseas Institutions. This will be done primarily by the utilisation of scholarship offers from foreign governments and Institutions, and from International Organisations. Applicants for overseas courses are also advised to apply for provisional admission to Institutions of their choice. They may seek the advice of the Students Advisory Committee of the Federal Ministry of Education.

8. Special attention of candidates who wish to apply from abroad is drawn to paragraph 2 above. They will not be awarded scholarships tenable abroad, if study or training in their chosen fields can be pursued in Nigeria or West African Institutions. Such candidates are therefore advised to apply promptly for admission to Nigerian or West African Institutions of higher learning. If offered scholarships tenable in Nigeria or West Africa, they will be required to return to Nigeria or West Africa at their own expense.

9. *Other Qualifications Required :*

(a) Applications for scholarships may be submitted by candidates of either sex who are Nigerian citizens and who are under 30 years of age on 1st January, 1965,

(b) Successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination of fitness which will include a tuberculin test and an X-Ray examination of chest.
