The conditions under which medicated dusting powders may be imported at the lower rate of duty of 333 per cent ad valorem under item 71 of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff Act, 1958 (No. 60 of 1958), as amended by the Customs Tariff (Duties and Exemptions) (No. 7) Order, 1964, are as follow:—

- (a) approval by the Board, in respect of each brand, prior to importation;
