Accordingly, notice is given that call to the English Bar or passing the English Bar Final Examination will not in future be recognised by the Nigerian Council of Legal Education as complying with sections 3 and 4 of the Legal Education Act, 1962, thereby qualifying for admission to the Nigerian Law School, unless the person concerned—either.
  - (a) has in addition obtained a degree (not necessarily in law) of an approved University,
  - (b) was admitted as a student member of an Inn of Court in England before 1st June, 1965.
- 3. Earlier Information Circulars (Government Notices No. 955 and No. 2284) should be read in the light of the above which affects sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 2 of Government Notice No. 955 and sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 12 of Government Notice No. 2284. In all other respects the Council's policy and practice as stated in those Circulars remains unchanged.
