TEMPORARY IMPORTATION OF POSITIVE CINEMATOGRAPH FILMS

Commencement : 10th June, 1965

Notes.—In this Notice, 'established' means incorporated, registered or engaged in business.

In exercise of the power conferred on the Board of Customs and Excise by section 40 (1) of the Customs and Excise Management Act (No. 55 of 1958), it is hereby notified that the provisions of temporary importation without payment of duty shall, subject to certain conditions, apply to the positive cinematograph films stated herein.

2. *Positive Cinematograph films to which this notice applies.*—The following positive cinematograph films may be temporarily imported without payment of duty :—

- (a) films intended for exhibition at International Fairs, Trade Shows and similar events ;
- (b) advertising positive cinematograph films of a width not exceeding 16 mm. consisting essentially of photographs (with or without a sound track) showing the nature or operation of products or equipment whose qualities cannot be adequately demonstrated by samples or catalogues.

3. *Conditions of Importation.*—(a) The films must be re-exported within six months or such longer period as the Board may allow.

(b) In the case of films imported by persons established in Nigeria an amount equal to the import duty must be deposited with the Board or a security by bond for the import duty must be given.

(c) In the absence of other satisfactory evidence of the nature of the films imported under this Notice, the Board may require the proprietor to obtain a report from the Federal Censorship Board appointed under section 3 of the Cinematograph Act 1963, No. 7.

(d) In the case of advertising films, the films must :—

- (i) relate to the products or equipment offered for sale or for hire by a person established outside Nigeria ;
- (ii) be of a kind suitable for exhibition to prospective customers and not for general exhibition to the public ;
- (iii) be imported in a packet which contains not more than one copy of each film and which does not form part of a larger consignment of films.

4. *Refund of Duty or Release of Security.*—A refund of such import duty deposited, or release of any security given in respect of films re-exported within the time allowed, shall be effected at the Custom House at the place or port of exportation.

5. *Payment of Duty on Films not re-exported.*—Films not re-exported within a period of six months or of such longer period, as may be allowed by the Board will be charged import duty in accordance with the provisions of the Customs and Excise Management Act (No. 55 of 1958) and the Customs Tariff Act (No. 60 of 1958). Where the duty was deposited with the Board, the amount will be adjusted to revenue and where it was secured by bond, the bond will be put into suit.
