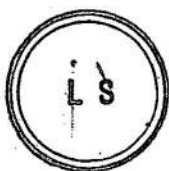

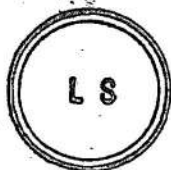

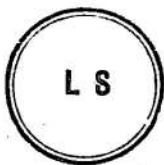

TIMBER EXPLOITATION: KABBA DIVISION

The Native Authorities of the Kabba Division of the Kabba Province of Northern Nigeria are prepared to consider jointly applications for an exclusive timber licence to take timber from all forests, both reserved and unreserved, of Kabba Division.

2. Exploitable high forest occurs as extensive unreserved areas and as parts of the following forest reserves:—

Bunu Native Authority No. 2 Olle Forest Reserve.

Bunu Native Authority Forest Reserve No. 3 [Oinyi River (Oyin River) Forests].

Lai (Ilai) Forest Reserve (Igbedde No. 1 and Yagba No. 2).

Bunu Native Authority Forest Reserve No. 1 (Choko-Choko Forests).

Kabba Government Reserve No. 5 (Bunu Forest Reserve).

West Yagba Native Authority Ogbè Forest Reserve.

Ebba River Forest Reserve (Kabba Native Administration).

3. The total area of exploitable high forest in the Olle, Oinyi River and Lai forest reserves is estimated to be in the region of 11 square miles. No reliable assessment has yet been made of the total area of exploitable high forest in the Choko-Choko, Bunu, Ogbe and Ebba River forest reserves, but it is unlikely to exceed 30 square miles.

4. A 10 per cent enumeration of the Olle Forest Reserve was done by the Forestry Division in 1958; a summary of the information can be inspected by arrangement with the Provincial Forest Officer, Lokoja. Further enumerations were carried out by a commercial firm in 1960 in the Olle, Oinyi River and Lai Forest reserves and in unreserved forests; the data for these enumerations remain the property of the firm.

5. An exclusive timber licence will embody the following among other, conditions:—

(a) The licence will be valid for 10 years.

(b) Outside forest reserves, exploitation will not be controlled by area, volume of girth limit, but a certain proportion of commercially utilizable species over 8 feet girth will be left standing for utilization under permit by local pitsawyers.

(c) Inside forest reserves, exploitation will be subject to the prescriptions of a working plan approved by the Chief Conservator of Forests. Such a working plan will provide for:

(i) Division of the area into two working circles, the first comprising the Olle, Oinyi River and Lai forest reserves, and the second comprising the Choko-Choko, Bunu, Ogbe and Ebba River forest reserves.

(ii) Enumeration of the forests of the second working circle as a prior condition for entry to that working circle.

(iii) Felling control on a felling cycle of 25 years by annual coupes of equal area and by minimum girth limits, with the proviso that overmature trees (as defined by the Chief Conservator of Forests) may be felled throughout the first working circle during the period of the licence.

(iv) Obligatory exploitation of all merchantable trees of the following species:—
