No reliable assessment has yet been made of the total area of exploitable high forest in the Choko-Choko, Bunu, Ogbe and Ebba River forest reserves, but it is unlikely to exceed 30 square miles.
- 4. A 10 per cent enumeration of the Olle Forest Reserve was done by the Forestry Division in 1958; a summary of the information can be inspected by arrangement with the Provincial Forest Officer, Lokoja. Further enumerations were carried out by a commercial firm in 1960 in the Olle, Oinyi River and Lai Forest reserves and in unreserved forests; the data for these enumerations remain the property of the firm.
- 5. An exclusive timber licence will embody the following among other, conditions:—
  - (a) The licence will be valid for 10 years.
  - (b) Outside forest reserves, exploitation will not be controlled by area, volume of girth limit, but a certain proportion of commercially utilizable species over 8 feet girth will be left standing for utilization under permit by local pitsawyers.

    - (iii) Felling, control on a felling cycle of 25 years by annual compes of equal area and by minimum girth limits, with the proviso that overmature trees (as defined by the Chief Conservator of Forests) may be felled throughout the first working circle during the period of the licence.
