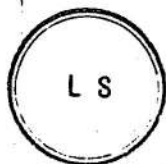

NOTICE BY THE BOARD OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

Customs and Excise Notice No. 24

REFUND AND REMISSION OF EXCISE DUTY ON BEER

GENERAL

LAW : The attention of all concerned is invited to section 121 of the Customs and Excise Management Act No. 55 of 1958 and section 6 of the Customs and Excise Act No. 38 of 1962.

2. **DEFINITIONS :** "REFUND" embraces all acts of repayment of monies brought to account as revenue.

3. "REMISSION" means the cancellation of a liability to pay duty due on goods which are lost or destroyed before such duty has been paid and brought to account as revenue.

4. **ADMINISTRATIVE CHARGE :** An administrative charge of ten shillings is raised on every claim for refund except where the claim arises from a mistake made by an officer of the Customs and Excise Department.

PART I.—REFUND

5. **ELIGIBILITY :** Claims for refund of excise duty may be considered where any worts or beer on which excise duty has been paid—

- (i) have been destroyed ; or
- (ii) become spoilt or otherwise unfit for use, before first delivery from the entered premises of a brewer after manufacture.

6. **CONDITIONS :** (a) To qualify for refund of excise duty paid on any worts or beer which have been destroyed, it is to be proved to the satisfaction of the Board that :—

- (i) the worts or beer were manufactured by the brewer claiming refund ;
- (ii) the destruction was by accident and the proper officer was notified at the first opportunity ; and
- (iii) the worts or beer were destroyed while on the entered premises of the brewer.

(b) To qualify for refund of excise duty paid on any worts or beer which have become spoilt or otherwise unfit for use, it is to be proved to the satisfaction of the Board that :—

- (i) the worts or beer were manufactured by the brewer claiming refund ;
- (ii) the worts or beer have become spoilt or unfit for use while on the entered premises of the brewer ; and
- (iii) the worts or beer have been destroyed with the permission and in the presence of the proper officer.

7. **APPLICATIONS :** (a) There is no special form of application for claiming refund of duty.

(b) Claims are to be submitted in writing, addressed to the Board through the proper officer in charge of the licensed brewer's premises.

(c) Where the claim is in respect of worts or beer destroyed, the application is to state :—

- (i) the customs and excise receipt on which the duty was paid ;
- (ii) details of the vessel or vessels in which the worts or beer were contained ;
- (iii) the quantity and description of the worts or beer ;
- (iv) the date the worts or beer were brewed ;
- (v) the original gravity, or, in the case of mixings, the proportions and original gravities of the constituents ;
- (vi) the full details of the accident resulting in the destruction of the worts or beer supported by such documentary evidence to satisfy the Board that the conditions for refund of duty have been fulfilled—see paragraph 6 (a)

(d) Where the claim is in respect of worts or beer which have become spoilt or otherwise unfit for use, the application is to state :—

- (i) the customs and excise receipt on which the duty was paid ;
- (ii) details of the vessel or vessels in which the worts or beer are contained ;
- (iii) the quantity and description of the worts or beer ;
- (iv) the date the worts or beer were brewed ;
- (v) the original gravity, or, in the case of mixings, the proportions and original gravities of the constituents ;
- (vi) the arrangements for checking the quantity and the method of destruction ; and
- (vii) the circumstances in which the worts or beer have become spoilt or unfit for use supported by such documentary evidence to satisfy the Board that the conditions for refund of duty have been fulfilled—see paragraph 6 (b)

8. **MINIMUM CLAIMS:** Claims for refund in respect of individual amounts less than one shilling are not accepted.

9. **CLAIMANT:** Claims for refund of excise duty are accepted only from the brewer who originally paid the excise duty.

10. **REJECTED CLAIMS:** Whenever a claim is not accepted by the proper officer the claimant is notified and the reason or reasons for rejection stated in the letter.

11. **BOARD'S DECISION:** The Board's decision will be notified in writing to the claimant stating the amount of refund approved and the accounting arrangements.

PART II.—REMISSION

12. **ELIGIBILITY:** Claims for remission of excise duty may be considered where:—

- (a) beer chargeable with excise duty has been lost or destroyed by accident whilst—
 - (i) in an approved bonded warehouse; or
 - (ii) being lawfully removed under bond or security;

- (b) any worts or beer on which excise duty has become chargeable, but not yet paid—
 - (i) have been destroyed, or
 - (ii) become spoilt or unfit for use,before first delivery from the entered premises of the brewer after manufacture.

13. **CONDITIONS:** To qualify for remission of excise duty chargeable but not yet paid:—

(a) on beer lost or destroyed by accident whilst in an approved bonded warehouse or whilst being lawfully removed under bond or security, the Board is to be satisfied that such beer has not or will not be used or consumed in Nigeria;

(b) on any worts or beer which have been destroyed, it is to be proved to the satisfaction of the Board that the conditions laid down in paragraph 6 (a) (i) to (iii) have been met;

(c) on any worts or beer which have become spoilt or unfit for use, it is to be proved to the satisfaction of the Board that the conditions laid down in paragraph 6 (b) (i) to (iii) have been met.

14. **APPLICATIONS:** (a) There is no special form of application for claiming remission of duty.

(b) Claims are to be submitted in writing addressed to the Board through the proper officer in charge of the licensed brewer's premises.

(c) Where the claim is submitted in accordance with paragraph 12 (a), the claimant is to state full details of:—

- (i) the accident resulting in the loss or destruction of the goods;
- (ii) the goods lost or destroyed and the amount of duty involved;
- (iii) the part played by the proper officer when the accident was notified and, where possible, statements from independent witnesses (i.e., persons other than those employed by the Warehousekeeper or the Proprietor of the goods);

(d) Where the claim is in respect of worts or beer destroyed the application is to state:—

- (i) the information required in paragraphs 7 (c) (ii) to (v); and
- (ii) the full details of the accident resulting in the destruction of the worts or beer supported by such documentary evidence to satisfy the Board that the conditions for remission of duty have been fulfilled—see paragraph 13 (b).

(e) Where the claim is in respect of worts or beer which have become spoilt or unfit for use, the application is to state:—

- (i) the information required in paragraph 7 (d) (iii) (vi); and
- (ii) the circumstances in which the worts or beer have become spoilt or unfit for use supported by such documentary evidence to satisfy the Board that the conditions for remission of duty have been fulfilled—see paragraph 13 (c).

15. **MINIMUM CLAIMS:** Claims for remission of duty in respect of individual amounts less than one shilling are not accepted.

16. **CLAIMANT:** Claims for remission of duty are accepted only from the proprietor of the beer referred to in paragraph 12 (a) or the brewer of the worts or beer referred to in paragraph 12 (b).

17. **BOARD'S DECISION:** The Board's decision is notified in writing to the claimant stating the amount of duty remission approved and the accounting arrangements.

*Government Notice No. 1551***FREE PRIMARY EDUCATION—1965 REGISTRATION OF ELIGIBLE CHILDREN**

In exercise of the powers conferred on him under section 14 (i) of the Education (Lagos) Ordinance, 1957, the Federal Minister of Education, Honourable R. O. A. Akinjide, has authorised his Chief Education Officer (Primary Education), Mr E. J. Moses, to conduct the registration of children of Primary School age, in 1965, within the Federal Territory of Lagos.

2. Registration is scheduled at 105 centres. A list of the centres and details of the arrangements for the registration, appeals, allocation and issuing of registration cards will be sufficiently publicised, well in advance, in the press and over the radio and television networks.

3. To be eligible for registration:

(a) a child must be five, but below six, years on December 31st, 1965; and

(b) the parents of such a child must be genuinely resident in the Federal Territory of Lagos.

Parents should note that, unless a child satisfies these conditions, he or she cannot qualify for a place in a maintained primary school.

4. Every child shall be accompanied to the registration centre by either of the parents or by a legal guardian who shall provide:

(a) satisfactory evidence of the child's age;

(b) two passport-size photographs of the child; and

(c) a certificate of recent small-pox vaccination.

5. Registration Officers shall be empowered to reject any child who appears under or above the prescribed age limit.
