THE FEDERAL TERRITORY OF LAGOS AND THE
NIGER DELTA SPECIAL AREA

Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates from the Federal Territory of Lagos and the Niger Delta Special Area for Federal Government Scholarships, Secondary School Awards, 1965.

2. *Qualifications:*

(a) Applicants must be of Secondary School age;

(b) They must show evidence that they were born in the Federal Territory of Lagos, the Niger Delta Special Area;

(c) That at least one of their parents was born or has been resident in the Federal Territory of Lagos for at least 30 years, in the case of applicants for the Federal Territory Awards; or at least one parent born in the Niger Delta Special Area in the case of those applying for Awards for this Area;

(d) They must show evidence either that they are already attending a recognised Secondary School or have gained admission to such a school.

3. *Method of application.*—Application forms must be completed by the candidate in his or her own hand-writing and must be accompanied by a birth certificate or a sworn declaration of age and a copy of a passport size photograph. They must be submitted through the Principal of the Secondary School which the candidate is attending or to which he has obtained admission. These application forms are obtainable from the Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Education (Scholarships Division), Lagos.
