

Instrument of Appointment to be the Chairman of the Advisory Council on the Prerogative of Mercy

NNAMDI AZIKIWE President

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by subsection (1) of section 101 of the Constitution of the Federation, I, NNAMDI AZIKIWE, President and Commander-in-Chief of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, do hereby, appoint with effect from the 26th of July, 1965, Alhaji the Hon. Muhammadu Inuwa Wada, member of the Council of Ministers to be the Chairman of the Advisory Council on the Prerogative of Mercy, in accordance with section 102 (1) (a) of the Constitution of the Federation.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Federal Republic of Nigeria at State House, Lagos, this twenty-fourth day of August, 1965.

- 6. Any person who shall wilfully hinder or obstruct the President or any person employed by him from taking possession of the said land is liable under the Provisions of the Act above-mentioned on conviction to a fine of twenty-five pounds or to imprisonment for three months.

- (b) Containers.—(i) Palm Kernels 'B' Twill Bags will be supplied to Licensed Buying Agents by the Board. Applicants must, however, produce evidence of ability to provide sufficient twine to cover at least the minimum purchase.
- (ii) Palm Oil. Applicants must show that they possess enough drums/casks to cover the minimum purchase requirements.
- (c) Capital.—Applicants will be required to produce acceptable evidence of their ability to provide the necessary capital to finance their purchases. Buying Agents have to be in a position to buy at not less than minimum prices at gazetted buying stations and to arrange for the produce to be evacuated to port (in the case of Palm Kernels) or Bulk Oil Plant (in the case of Palm Oil) at which point payment is made against delivery of the produce in the approved manner. The minimum capital requirements are as follows:

(d) Storage.—Applicants must be able to provide evidence that they have available in their proposed areas of operation proper storage to cover at least two hundred tons of Palm Kernels, and adequate port storage where appropriate.

All stores must comply with the requirements of, and be approved by the Mid-Western Nigeria Produce Inspection Service. It is the responsibility of the applicant to request in writing the Produce Officer of the area concerned to inspect and approve his store.

- (e) General.—An applicant must be prepared to produce satisfactory evidence to show that he is fully conversant with the produce trade in question and that in particular he will be able to fulfil the following conditions:
 - (i) Equipment.—That he possesses the required equipment for the grading of produce for export.
 - (ii) Inspection of produce:—That he will be able to provide grading equipment and an adequate labour force at all stores.
 - (iii) Returns.—That he will render promptly and accurately all returns particularly as to purchases and stocks, which may be called for by the Board's executive.
 - (iv) Evacuation.—That he will be able to make arrangements to secure the necessary transport by road, rail and water to ensure the smooth and regular evacuation of produce by approved routes.
 - (v) Delivery.—That he can arrange delivery of Palm Oil to the appropriate Bulk Oil Plant and of Palm Kernels on board ocean-going vessels. In the case of Palm Kernels he must possess the organisation at port or the ability to secure reliable agents to ensure the accurate preparation and prompt submission of shipping documents as required and the carrying of all duties involved in the delivery of Palm Kernels to f.o.b. point.
- 4.
