## INTRODUCTORY NOTE

The question of the extent of the treaty obligations of Nigeria under the Exchange of Letters with the United Kingdom Government has been under constant study in the Federal Ministry of Justice since our attainment of independence. The difficulty of ascertaining how many such treaties and other international agreements bind or may be deemed to bind Nigeria in virtue of United Kingdom signature or ratification in the past has been due in part to the fact that it has not been possible to obtain copies of a number of these treaties.

2. A list of the multilateral treaties and of the few bilateral treaties that have been recognised as clearly binding on Nigeria will be found in Schedule "A" to this notice. Subsequent lists of recognised treaties will be published from time to time for general information. A list of treaties and other international agreements that have been acceded to or concluded between October 1st, 1960 and December 31st, 1964 is Schedule "B".

3. It is expected that copies of the remaining treaties and other international agreements will soon be available for study, after which a comprehensive list of "NIGERIA'S TREATIES IN FORCE" for the period October 1st, 1960 to September 30th, 1965 will be published for sale to the public. Thereafter, annual volumes will be printed and offered for sale to the public.

REFUND AND REMISSION OF EXCISE DUTY ON BEER  
GENERAL

## LAW :

Attention is invited to section 121 of the Customs and Excise Management Act (No. 55 of 1958) and section 6 of the Customs and Excise Act 1962, No. 38.

## DEFINITIONS:

2. "REFUND" embraces all repayments of monies brought to account as revenue.

3. "REMISSION" means the cancellation of a liability to pay duty due on goods which are lost or destroyed, before such duty has been paid and brought to account as revenue.

## ADMINISTRATIVE CHARGE :

4. An administrative charge of ten shillings is raised on every claim for refund.

## PART I—REFUND

## ELIGIBILITY :

5. Claims for refund of excise duty may be considered where any worts or beer on which excise duty has been paid—

- (a) has been destroyed ; or
- (b) become spoilt or otherwise unfit for use, before first delivery from the entered premises of a brewer after manufacture.

## CONDITIONS :

6. (a) To qualify for refund of excise duty paid on any worts or beer which have been destroyed, it is to be proved to the satisfaction of the Board that—

- (i) the worts or beer was manufactured by the brewer claiming refund ;
- (ii) the destruction was by accident and the proper officer was notified at the first opportunity ; and
- (iii) the worts or beer was destroyed while on the entered premises of the brewer.

(b) To qualify for refund of excise duty paid on any worts or beer which has become spoilt or otherwise unfit for use, it is to be proved to the satisfaction of the Board that—

- (i) the worts or beer was manufactured by the brewer claiming refund ;
- (ii) the worts or beer has become spoilt or unfit for use while on the entered premises of the brewer ; and
- (iii) the worts or beer has been destroyed with the permission and in the presence of the proper officer.

## APPLICATION :

7. (a) There is no special form of application for claiming refund of excise duty.

(b) Claims are to be submitted in writing, addressed to the appropriate Chief Collector through the officer of Customs and Excise in charge of the licensed brewer's premises.

(c) Where the claim is in respect of worts or beer destroyed, the application is to include—

- (i) particulars of the Customs and Excise receipt on which the duty was paid ;
- (ii) details of the vessel/s in which the worts or beer was contained ;
- (iii) the quantity and description of the worts or beer ;
- (iv) the date the worts or beer was brewed ;
- (v) the original gravity or, in the case of mixings, the proportions and original gravities of the constituents ;
- (vi) the full details of the accident resulting in the destruction of the worts or beer, supported by documentary evidence to satisfy the Board that the conditions for refund of duty have been fulfilled—

paragraph 6 (a).

(d) Where the claim is in respect of worts or beer which has become spoilt or otherwise unfit for use, the application is to include—

- (i) particulars of the customs and excise receipt on which the duty was paid ;
- (ii) details of the vessel/s in which the worts or beer is contained ;
- (iii) the quantity and description of the worts or beer ;
- (iv) the date the worts or beer was brewed ;
- (v) the original gravity or, in the case of mixings, the proportions and original gravities of the constituents ;
- (vi) the arrangements for checking the quantity and the method of destruction ; and
- (vii) the circumstances in which the worts or beer became spoilt or unfit for use, supported by documentary evidence to satisfy the Board that the conditions for refund of duty have been fulfilled—see paragraph 6 (b).

## MINIMUM CLAIMS :

8. Claims for refund in respect of individual amounts less than one shilling are not acceptable and, due to the administrative charge of ten shillings, claims in respect of individual amounts less than ten shillings cannot be met.

## CLAIMANT :

9. Claims for refund of excise duty are accepted only from the brewer who originally paid the excise duty.

NOTICE BY THE BOARD OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE—*continued*

## REJECTED CLAIMS :

10. Whenever a claim is not met by the proper officer the claimant is notified and the reason/s for rejection stated.

## DECISION :

11. The decision on every claim is notified in writing to the claimant and the amount of refund approved where any—as well as the accounting arrangements stated.

## PART II—REMISSION

## ELIGIBILITY :

12. Claims for remission of excise duty may be considered where :—

(a) beer chargeable with excise duty has been lost or destroyed by accident whilst—

(i) in an approved bonded warehouse ; or

(ii) being lawfully removed under bond or security ;

(b) any worts or beer on which excise duty has become chargeable, but not yet paid—

(i) has been destroyed, or

(ii) become spoilt or unfit for use, before first delivery from the entered premises of the brewer after manufacture.

## CONDITIONS :

13. to qualify for remission of excise duty chargeable but not yet paid :—

(a) on beer lost or destroyed by accident whilst in an approved bonded warehouse or whilst being lawfully removed under bond or security, the Board is to be satisfied that such beer has not or will not be used or consumed in Nigeria ;

(b) on any worts or beer which has been destroyed, it is to be proved to the satisfaction of the Board that the conditions laid down in paragraph 6 (a) (i) to (iii) have been met ;

(c) on any worts or beer which has become spoilt or unfit for use, it is to be proved to the satisfaction of the Board that the conditions laid down in paragraph 6 (b) (i) to (iii) have been met.

## APPLICATIONS :

14. (a) There is no special form of application for claiming remission of duty.

(b) Claims are to be submitted in writing addressed to the appropriate Chief Collector through the proper officer of Customs and Excise in charge of the licensed brewer's premises.

(c) Where the claim is submitted in accordance with paragraph 12 (a), the claimant is to state full details of :—

(i) the accident resulting in the loss or destruction of the goods ;

(ii) the goods lost or destroyed and the amount of duty involved ;

(iii) the part played by the proper officer when the accident was notified and, where possible, statements from independent witnesses (*i.e.*, persons other than those employed by the Warehouse Keeper or the Proprietor of the goods) ;

(d) Where the claim is in respect of worts or beer destroyed, the application is to include :—

(i) the information required in paragraph 7 (c) (ii) to (v) ; and

(ii) the full details of the accident resulting in the destruction of the worts or beer, supported by documentary evidence to satisfy the Board that the conditions for remission of duty have been fulfilled—*see* paragraph 13 (b).

(e) Where the claim is in respect of worts or beer which has become spoilt or unfit for use, the application is to include :—

(i) the information required in paragraph 7 (d) (iii) to (vi) ; and

(ii) particulars of the circumstances in which the worts or beer became spoilt or unfit for use, supported by documentary evidence to satisfy the Board that the conditions for remission of duty have been fulfilled—*see* paragraph 13 (c).

## MINIMUM CLAIMS :

15. Claims for remission of duty in respect of individual amounts less than one shilling are not acceptable and, due to the administrative charge of ten shillings, claims in respect of individual amounts less than ten shillings cannot be met.

## CLAIMANT :

16. Claims for remission of duty are accepted only from the proprietor of the beer referred to in paragraph 12 (a) or the brewer of the worts or beer referred to in paragraph 12 (b).

## DECISION :

17. The decision on every claim is notified in writing to the claimant and the amount of duty remission approved—where any—as well as the accounting arrangements stated.
