## WESTERN NIGERIA MARKETING BOARD

## 1965-66 COCOA MARKETING SCHEME: MINIMUM BUYING STATION PRICES

It is notified for general information that the Western Nigeria Marketing Board, by virtue of its powers under section 16 (a) of the Marketing Board Law (Cap. 75 of the Laws of the Western Region of Nigeria, 1959), has fixed the prices set out in columns II and III of the schedule subjoined as the minimum prices payable for cocoa during the 1965-66 season at gazetted buying stations in the Western Region specified in column I.

2. The minimum buying stations prices are based on the naked ex-scale port of shipment prices fixed by the Board for the 1965-66 season less the transport differentials by the approved evacuation routes.

## PRODUCE SALES TAX

3. Under the provisions of the Western Region Produce Sales Tax Law (Cap. 99 of the Laws of the Western Region of Nigeria, 1959), all sales of cocoa made in the Western Region to the licensed buying agents of the Western Nigeria Marketing Board are subject to produce sales tax at the rate of £4 per ton.

4. For purposes of collection of this tax, for which under the Western Region Produce Sales Tax Law, 1957 the Marketing Board is accountable to the appropriate regional authority in respect of all sales of cocoa made to it or to its licensed buying agents in the Region the arrangements as set out in paragraph 5 are prescribed.

5. The prices payable by the licensed buying agents of the Marketing Board for cocoa in the Western Region will take into account the incidence of produce sales tax and will accordingly be at the rates set out in Columns IV and V of the schedule subjoined (being the minimum buying station prices fixed by the Marketing Board reduced by the amount of produce sales tax).

(d) Participating in the organization and supervision of technical assistance required for the implementation of Bank/IDA financed projects.

3. A number of appointments are to be made to the staff of the Educational Planning Division of persons who will take part in the above types of activity. The bulk of their work will be carried out in missions to Member States and it is expected that the appointees will spend up to one-third of their time in the field. The remainder of their time will be spent at Headquarters preparing for missions, analysing and commenting on reports or completing reports of previous missions.

1. *Qualifications and experience required.*—Applicants are required to be of the highest quality and to have proven ability in disciplines related to the financing and administration of education—educators, education administrators, economists with particular interest in educational questions sociologists would be among those considered for appointment.

Only candidates who reach a qualifying standard in the written examination and the Extended Interview will be invited to the interview by the Public Service Commission.

4. To qualify for admission to the competition in 1966, a candidate must either be in possession of a qualification prescribed for the post for which he wishes to compete or intend to sit in 1966 for the final examination leading to the qualification. The qualifications prescribed for the Administrative and Special Departmental Classes are as follows:—

#### (i) ADMINISTRATIVE CLASS:

(a) First or Second-class Honours Degree, preferably in Arts or Economics or Business Administration from a recognized University.

(b) Third-class Honours or First or Second-class General Degree plus a higher Degree or a Diploma in Public Administration from a recognized University.

#### (ii) AUDITOR AND ACCOUNTANT:

(a) Final Certificate of one of the following professional bodies:—

(i) Chartered Accountants

(ii) Society of Incorporated Accountants and Auditors.

(iii) Association of Certified and Corporate Accountants.

(iv) Institute of Cost and Works Accountant.

(v) Institute of Municipal Treasurers and Accountants.

(b) Honours Degree in Accountancy or in Economics or related subjects with Accountancy as a Special Subject, from a recognized University.

For 1966, candidates in possession of any of the professional qualifications listed in (a) above will be exempt from the written examination.

(iii) MANAGEMENT OFFICER AND ASSISTANT REGISTRAR OF CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES:

First or Second-class Honours Degree in Economics from a recognized University.

(iv) REVENUE INSPECTOR:

(a) Any of the accounting qualifications listed in sub-paragraph (i) (a) and (b) above.

(b) A Degree in Law from a recognized University.

(c) A call to the Bar.

(v) PRODUCE OFFICER:

A Degree in Agriculture, Commerce or Economics from a recognized University.

"Recognized" in the above contexts means "recognized by the Government of Eastern Nigeria".

5. The written examination will not be designed to test candidates on the subjects in which they hold a Degree. It will be designed to test ability to think clearly and to understand and write English, and also of knowledge of affairs, particularly West African Affairs. Notes for the guidance of candidates drawn up by the West African Examinations Council will be issued to all candidates in due course. The examination will comprise the following papers:—

(i) *English (Precis and Critical Appreciation)*.—This paper will consist of a precis of a passage supplemented by a question asking candidates to comment critically on the central idea of the passage.

(ii) *Current Affairs*.—Candidates will be required to answer FOUR questions out of TEN and the range of subjects will cater for all types of candidates offering, and are designed to test the intelligent awareness of current affairs which any educated person may be presumed to possess.

(iii) *General*.—This will consist of two questions. one will test ability to detect dubious thinking, and will contain short passages whose *Logical Force* is to be discussed critically. The other will test ability to draw *Statistical Inferences* from a table of numerical data.

6. This written examination will be held on the 28th March, 1966 in Lagos, Ibadan, Enugu, London, Washington and at such other centres as may be decided later.

7. Minimum transport expenses to and from London and Washington will be refunded to candi-

dates in the British Isles or the United States respectively who are not resident in those cities, for the purpose of taking the written examination. Candidates will be responsible for arranging and meeting the cost of their accommodation and transport.

8. A fee of £2 is payable by those wishing to attempt the competition.

9. Candidates who have already applied on Eastern Nigeria Form P.S.C. 1 for appointment to one or more of the classes mentioned in paragraph 1 above should, if in Nigeria send to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Enugu, a Treasury Receipt for the £2 competition fee or, if outside Nigeria, send £2 by Money Order or crossed Postal Order to the authority to whom they addressed their applications on Eastern Nigeria Form P.S.C. 1 under a covering letter referring to their applications. 10. Fees are not refundable, and no responsibility can be accepted for money sent in other than the prescribed manner.

11. Instructions as to the date, time and place of attendance will be sent direct to individual candidates.

12. Candidates may still be offered temporary appointments by the Public Service Commission to any of the posts listed in paragraph 1 above on the strict understanding that if they are unsuccessful at any stage of the next competition, their temporary appointments will be terminated unless they are offered other posts.
