He should liaise with Departmental Officers in respect of all stores matters, supervise all shipping, customs and transport facilities, set up and supervise local purchases and supply contract arrangements at area level. A Stores Officer will also be required to carry out regular surprise check on Stores, investigate discrepancies and arrange for the rectification of same. He will also prepare and submit reports to the Chief Accounting Officer of the Ministry or Non-Ministerial Department on all aspects of stores accounting.

5. *Other conditions of service*.—(i) The post is pensionable, and in the case of a new entrant, appointment would be on probation for three years.

(ii) Rent is payable at 8½ per cent of basic salary when an officer is occupying Government Quarters.
