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

REVOCATION OF INSTRUMENT OF TEMPORARY AUTHORITY TO PERFORM FUNCTIONS OF THE PRIME MINISTER

(Restricted Commencement) Order

NWAFOR ORIZU Acting President

Whereas, by an Instrument given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Federal Republic of Nigeria on the 14th day of December, 1965, Alhaji the Honourable Muhammadu Inuwa Wada, M.P., Minister of Defence was temporarily authorised to perform sundry functions conferred upon the Prime Minister by the Constitution of the Federation during the absence of the Prime Minister from Nigeria.

AND Whereas the Prime Minister returned to Nigeria on the 15th day of December, 1965:

Now, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 92 of the Constitution of the Federation, I, NWAFOR ORIZU, Acting President and Commander-in-Chief of the Federal Republic of Nigeria do hereby revoke, with effect from the 16th day of December, 1965, the Instrument of Temporary Authority, given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Federal Republic of Nigeria on the 14th day of December, 1965, as aforesaid.
