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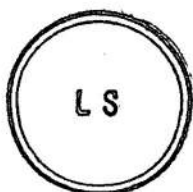

REVOCATION OF INSTRUMENT OF TEMPORARY AUTHORITY TO PERFORM FUNCTIONS OF THE PRIME MINISTER

WHEREAS, by an Instrument given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Federal Republic of Nigeria on the 14th day of December, 1965, Alhaji the Honourable Muhammadu Inuwa Wada, M.P., Minister of Defence was temporarily authorised to perform sundry functions conferred upon the Prime Minister by the Constitution of the Federation during the absence of the Prime Minister from Nigeria.

AND Whereas the Prime Minister returned to Nigeria on the 15th day of December, 1965 :

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 92 of the Constitution of the Federation, I, NWAFOR ORIZU, Acting President and Commander-in-Chief of the Federal Republic of Nigeria do hereby revoke, with effect from the 16th day of December, 1965, the Instrument of Temporary Authority, given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Federal Republic of Nigeria on the 14th day of December, 1965, as aforesaid.

"Where it is considered that the conduct of an officer is prejudicial to the security of the State, and where a committee comprising members from the Cabinet Office, the Ministry of Justice and the Ministry of Establishments is satisfied that an officer has committed a misconduct involving the security of the State, the procedures laid down in the present section need not be followed by the Federal Public Service Commission in taking any disciplinary action it may deem fit."
