ACCOUNTS

The Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Account of the Bank, which reflect the financial results of the Bank's operations during 1964, appear on the following pages.

The increase in total external reserves, reflects partly further centralization of the country's external reserves, and partly the improvement noted in Nigeria's capital account during the year.

The rise in the Bank's holdings of 'Other Securities' is partly accounted for by the Bank's contribution to the shares of the Nigerian Industrial Development Bank, and the Nigerian Security Printing and Minting Company, and partly to an increase in the holdings of other categories of securities.

The Bank's holdings of 'Federal Government Securities' rose during the year as a result of further subscriptions to Federal Government stocks in January, although the holdings of treasury bills were below the 1963 level. The rise in 'Rediscunts and Advances' reflects principally an enlargement of Central Bank facilities for produce financing during the current crop marketing season.

The increase of £15.7 million in currency in circulation at the end of 1964 represents a rise of 17.3 per cent over the amount in 1963.

REPORT OF THE AUDITORS

As Auditors appointed under Section 44 (1) of the Central Bank of Nigeria Act (Chapter 30), we have examined the below balance sheet and profit and loss account which are in agreement with the books of account. In our opinion proper books of account have been kept. We have obtained all information and explanations which we considered necessary for our audit and in our opinion these accounts show a true and fair view of the state of the Bank's affairs at 31st December, 1964 and of the profit, ascertained in the manner indicated, for the year ended on that date.
