(3) CIVIL ENGINEER

- (a) Qualification.—A degree or diploma in Civil Engineering recognised by the Institute of Civil Engineers or equivalent.
- (b) Duties.—The candidate selected would be required to serve as counterpart and to understudy a Technical Assistance Expert who is the Board's Civil Engineering/Hydrological Adviser. Experience in Hydrology will be an advantage, but if the successful engineer has no previous experience, he will be considered for in-service training in Hydrology.

(4) - FORESTRY OFFICER

- (a) Qualification.—Honours degree in Forestry or Botany.
- (b) Duties.—The candidate selected will be required to serve as counterpart and to understudy a Technical Assistance Expert who is at present the Forestry Adviser to the Board. Previous experience

will be an advantage and the successful candidate will eventually take over responsibility for the Forestry Division of the Board's activities.

Salary.—The posts are normally in scale A commencing from £972-1,020, £1,068-1,584. In deserving cases (due to experience, higher qualifications etc.), appointment or secondment will be made on the basis of scale A1 £1,368-1,422-1,890.

Other conditions.—The posts are not pensionable but the persons appointed will be eligible to participate in a Non-Contributory Provident Fund Scheme to which the Board pays 25 per cent of salary. Nigerian officers will be eligible to receive an allowance in lieu of housing of 81 per cent of salary. The other conditions of service are at present similar to those of members of the Federal Public Service of equivalent rank. Seconded officers will retain their rights in the Public Service including period of service under the Board. Overseas officers will be appointed on contract terms.

Method of application.—Application forms can be obtained from the office of the Secretary. Candidates in the Public Service and Statutory Corporations should ulmit their completed forms through their Heads of Departments with advance copies to the Secretary. All applications should be submitted to reach the Secretary not later than 31st of January, 1966.
