CHEMICAL PATHOLOGY

Courses.—The Department of Chemical Pathology offers a three year postgraduate programme leading to the degree of Ph.D. of the University of Ibadan. The programme is designed for the training of teachers in the fields of Biochemistry, Chemical Pathology and Experimental Medicine.

2. *Entry requirements.*—To be admitted as a regular graduate student, an applicant must have received a bachelor's degree or its equivalent at the University of Ibadan or another institution recognised by the University. During the first year, there will be regular course of instruction covering a number of topics in the Basic Sciences. Only candidates who have satisfactorily completed the first year course and passed the prescribed examination will be permitted to proceed to the second year. Candidates will devote the second and third years to the collection of materials for their thesis and participation in journal clubs and seminars.
