It is notified for general information that the Western Nigeria Marketing Board, by virtue of its powers under section 16 (a) of the Marketing Board Law (Cap. 75 of the Laws of the Western Region of Nigeria, 1959) has fixed the prices set out in Column II of the Schedule subjoined as the minimum prices payable for palm kernels during 1966 at gazetted buying stations in Western Nigeria specified in Column I.

2. The minimum prices are based on the naked ex-scale port of shipment price less the appropriate cost of transport by the approved normal routes.

## PRODUCE SALES TAX

3. Under the provisions of the Produce Sales Tax Law (Cap. 99 of the Laws of the Western Region of Nigeria, 1959), all sales of palm kernels made in Western Nigeria to Licensed Buying Agents of the Western Nigeria Marketing Board are subject to Produce Sales Tax at the rate of £1 per ton.

4. For purposes of collection of this tax for which the Marketing Board is accountable to the appropriate regional authority in respect of all sales of palm kernels made to it or to its licensed buying agents in the Region, the arrangements set out in paragraph 5 are prescribed.



5. The prices payable by the licensed buying agents of the Marketing Board for palm kernels in Western Nigeria will take into account the incidence of produce sales tax and will accordingly be at the rates set out in Column III of the Schedule subjoined (being the minimum buying station prices fixed by the Marketing Board reduced by the amount of the produce sales tax.)

Serving Government officials should submit their applications through the usual official channels.

5. The Inspector-General of Police may call suitably qualified candidates for interview.

The final selection will be made by the Police Service Commission. Closing date for receiving applications at the Police Service Commission is 19th March, 1966.

6. Candidates will be notified of the dates for the interview board at the office of the Inspector-General of Police and the final board by the Police Service Commission.

7. *Training.*—Graduates will be required to undertake the following training after enlistment in the Force—

12 months training at the Southern Police College commencing on a date to be notified later.

Training will include—

(a) 6 months' basic training including law and drill.

(b) 2 weeks' attachment (Station Officer).

(c) 1 month's Leadership and Citizenship Training Course (Kurra Falls).

(d) 2 weeks' break (approximately).

(e) 1 month's First Aid Lay Lecturer's Course.

(f) 3 months' advanced training including law, responsibilities of S.P.O. and drill.

A further period of attachment will follow the course.

On the successful conclusion of the training period described above, graduates will be posted to Police Provinces as Assistant Superintendents of Police on probation to work in an executive capacity for 24 months. Those who are not successful during or after training will have their appointments terminated. Candidates selected from other Government Departments will be accepted on secondment for training. If unsuccessful they may be transferred back to their original departments.

8. *Salary scale.*—The salary scale will be B1, 2—£690-1,116 (£690, £726, £864, £900, £936, £978 £1,068, £1,116).

9. *Promotion prospects.*—There are excellent prospects of promotion to Super Scale posts within the Force.

10. *Conditions of service.*—Appointments are pensionable. Three years after the date of their enlistment in the Force, graduates will be eligible for confirmation in the rank of A.S.P. (Scale B1, 2) subject to their passing the prescribed examinations and provided their conduct, efficiency and ability merit such confirmation.
