## Government Notice No. 534

## GOVERNMENT REFRIGERATORS

Many cases of damage to Refrigerators in Government Quarters have occurred recently due to the deep freeze compartment being punctured with a sharp instrument used either to chip off ice when defrosting or to release ice-trays which have become frozen to the deep freeze compartment. This damage is not repairable and a replacement unit is required which can cost up to £52.

2. The types of refrigerators usually involved are Electrolux Models SA.80A 8110 and S.105, English Electric, Kelvinators and other types to which the following notice is affixed.

"WARNING: Do not use sharp instruments for defrosting or removing ice-trays. The small ridges inside the deep freeze compartment if punctured will render the refrigerator unserviceable. The cost of the replacement of the units may be charged to the officer to whom the refrigerator is allocated. Damage to Refrigerators must be reported at once."

3. Occupants of Government quarters are warned that refrigerators thus damaged will not be replaced until the responsible officer has signed a written statement accepting liability for damage.

4. Damages arising from non-compliance with the above "Warning" will result in the officer to whom the refrigerator is allocated being charged with the cost of repairs.

5. The Superintending Engineers have been instructed to charge the occupant of quarters with the full cost of any such damage of this nature which occurs.

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS FOR UNDERGRADUATE  
STUDIES AND TECHNICAL TRAINING, 1966

Applications are invited for Federal Government Scholarship Awards for undergraduate studies and for technical training. The purpose of these scholarships is to enable young Nigerians with suitable qualifications to acquire the necessary knowledge and skills required in occupying vital posts in the Public Service and in other sectors of the Nigerian economy.

2. The fields of study, in order of priority, for which scholarship will be awarded are as shown below. Those marked 'N' are courses for which scholarships are tenable in Nigeria and those marked 'O' are tenable overseas.

UNDERGRADUATE AND PROFESSIONAL COURSES :

(i) *Medical and Health.*—Medicine (N), Nursing (Degree) (N), Dentistry (O), Pharmacy (N), Medical Laboratory Technology (Degree) (N).

(ii) *Agriculture, etc.*—Agriculture (N), Forestry (N), Veterinary (N).

(iii) *Engineering and Allied Subjects.*—Civil Engineering (N), Electrical Engineering (N), Mechanical and Automobile Engineering (N), Mining (O), Radio and Telecommunications, Aeronautical Engineering, Petroleum and Natural Gas Engineering (O), Naval Engineering (O), Architecture (N), Town Planning (O), Metallurgical Engineering (O), Surveying (N), Chemical Engineering (O).

(iv) *Economics and Allied Subjects.*—Economics (N), Banking (O), Accountancy (Degree) (N), Business Administration (N), Estate Management (O), Statistics (N), Agricultural Economics (N), Accountancy (Professional) (O).

(v) *Social Sciences.*—Sociology (N), Anthropology (N), Industrial Psychology (N), Psychology (other) (N).

(vi) *Basic Sciences.*—(N).

(vii) *Arts and Languages.*—(N).

(viii) *Other Courses.*—Archaeology (N), Fine Art (N), Commercial Art (N).

(ix) *Intermediate and Sub-Professional.*—Librarianship (O), Building Technology (N), Forestry (Diploma) (N), Food Technology/Dietetics (O), Leather Technology (O), Dental Technology (O), Medical/Laboratory Technology (O), Radiography (N), Physiotherapy (N), Pottery (O), Printing Technology (O), Photography/Cinematography (O), Refrigeration and Air Conditioning (O), Music/Drama (N), Textile Technology (O), Timber Technology (O), Mechanical Engineering Technology (N), Electronics and Electrical Engineering Technology (N), Chemical Technology (O), Glass Technology (O).

As will be observed, the majority of the above courses are tenable in Nigerian Institutions. The Scholarship Board exercises discretion in determining the place of study in a few cases where this has not been specifically indicated.

3. The number of awards in each field of study or training will be governed by the anticipated needs of the Federal Public Service, the Federal Statutory Corporations and generally Nigeria's manpower requirements in the various fields, with appropriate scales of priority.

4. *Value of Awards.*—Scholarships will not necessarily cover all costs of study or training, but in all cases it will cover at least the tuition fees. The present values of awards, which are subject to revision in the light of experience, are as follows :—

(a) Nigerian Universities and Institutions of higher learning	£160 per student per annum.
(b) United Kingdom and Europe	£360 per student per annum.
(c) United States and Canada	£576 per student per annum.



5. Candidates are advised to acquaint themselves with the conditions of admission to courses of study or training which they wish to undertake in order to ensure that they hold the requisite academic qualifications. The following points should be noted :—

(a) *For University Degree Courses.*—The qualifications required are the General Certificate of Education at Advanced Level or the Higher School Certificate at Principal Level in subjects appropriate to the intended courses of study, in addition to evidence of a general education to the level of the West African School Certificate, Grade II or its equivalent.

(b) *For Non-University Degree Courses.*—West African School Certificate or equivalent qualifications obtained through the General Certificate of Education at Ordinary Level or officially recognised examinations in subjects related to the proposed course of study.

6. In addition to submitting scholarship applications, candidates are expected to apply for admission direct to institutions of their choice. This applies in particular to candidates wishing to study subjects available in Nigeria and West African institutions of higher learning. Applicants for courses tenable overseas are also advised in their own interest to apply for provisional admission to institutions of their choice. Where they fail, successful candidates will be assisted by the Ministry in securing admissions. Candidates should generally acquaint themselves with the conditions of admission to their courses of study. In the case of successful candidates who produce evidence of admission to overseas institutions, the Scholarship Board normally confirm such admission through the appropriate Nigeria High Commission or Embassy in the country concerned.

7. In cases where courses of study are not available in Nigeria or West Africa, arrangements will be made, at the Board's discretion, to place successful candidates in overseas institutions. This will be done primarily by the utilisation of scholarship offers from foreign governments and institutions, and from international organisations.

8. It is necessary to draw the special attention of candidates who wish to apply from outside West Africa to paragraph 2 above. They will not be awarded scholarships tenable abroad, if study or training in their chosen fields can be pursued in Nigerian or West African institutions. Such candidates are therefore advised to apply promptly for admission to Nigerian or West African institutions of higher learning. If offered scholarships tenable in Nigeria or West Africa, they will be normally required to return to Nigeria or West Africa, at their own expense.

9. *Other qualifications required.*—(a) Applications for scholarships may be submitted by candidates of either sex who are Nigerian citizens and who are under 30 years of age on 1st January, 1966.

(b) Successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination of fitness which will include a tuberculin test and an X-Ray examination of chest.

10. *Application Forms.*—Scholarship application forms are obtainable from :—

- (a) The Federal Ministry of Education, Survey Building, Lagos ;
- (b) The Secretary, Northern Nigeria Scholarship Board, Kaduna ;
- (c) The Secretary, Eastern Nigeria Scholarship Board, Enugu ;
- (d) The Secretary, Western Nigeria Scholarship Board, Ibadan ;
- (e) The Secretary, Mid-Western Nigeria Scholarship Board, Benin City ;
- (f) All Nigeria High Commissions, Embassies and Consulates abroad ;
- (g) The Academic Registrars/Secretaries of all Nigerian Universities.

Candidates who require application forms to be sent to them by post should attach self-addressed envelopes marked 'SCHOLARSHIPS F.G. 1966' on the left-hand corner while applying for forms. Prospective candidates are required to fill two copies of the application form. Forms from applicants in Government Service or Statutory Corporations or other agencies of the Government or voluntary agencies should be forwarded through the applicants' Head of Department. Incorrectly filled forms will not be entertained.

11. *Submission of Application Forms.*—Two completed application forms together with two passport size photographs, photostat copies of certificates only (not originals) should be forwarded to the Permanent Secretary (Scholarships Section), Federal Ministry of Education, Lagos, so as to reach him not later than Saturday, 16th April, 1966.

*Note.*—(a) Candidates should adhere strictly to the foregoing instructions, as failure to do so may lead to rejection of the application.

(b) No late applications will be entertained.

(c) Candidates who are not qualified as stipulated at paragraph 5 (a) and (b) above need not apply.

(d) Candidates must not send their original certificates at the initial stage. They will be required later at the time of interviews. This Ministry will not be responsible for the loss of original certificates forwarded by candidates.

(e) Candidates from abroad could obtain forms from the Nigerian representatives in their respective countries. Such forms must be sent direct to the Ministry of Education in Lagos.
