(1961 No. 23)

PAY-AS-YOU-EARN DIRECTION 1966-67

Pursuant to section 50 (1) of the Personal Income Tax (Lagos) Act, 1961, and to all other powers enabling it in that behalf, and as a result of the changes in the tax rates set out in Table 2 of the Second Schedule to that Act (details of which changes will be published in a Decree) the Federal Board of Inland Revenue hereby gives the following direction.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Personal Income Tax (Lagos) (Employments) Regulations 1965 (L.N. 58 of 1965), every employer who is required by those Regulations to deduct income tax from the salary, wages, fees, allowances or other gains or profits from an employment paid or payable in money by the employer to an employee shall UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE deduct income tax by reference to the tax rates set out for MONTH ONE in the Tax Tables, and NOT by reference to the tax rates for ANY OTHER month in the tax tables.

3. New tax tables to replace the existing ones will be issued to all employers as soon as possible after the Decree has been enacted.

4. For the avoidance of doubt it is hereby directed that all allowances—including acting allowance, car basic allowance, mileage allowance in respect of home-to-office and office-to-home running (but not mileage allowance in respect of journeys on the employee's official duties), housing or rent allowance, children's allowance, overseas allowance, responsibility allowance, entertainment allowance, etc.—paid or payable in money by an employer to or on behalf of his employees shall be aggregated with the other emoluments in respect of which PAY-AS-YOU-EARN deductions are to be made. The only exceptions are cases where the Federal Board of Inland Revenue has (in the terms of section 4 (1) (b) (i) of the Income Tax Management Act, 1961) agreed in writing that any such allowance (for example, in respect of entertainment allowance or uniform allowance) represents reimbursement to the employee of expenses incurred by him in the performance of his official duties, and from which it is not intended that the employee should make any profit or gain. All other taxable allowances paid to or on behalf of an employee since 1st April, 1966 must therefore be included in the P.A.Y.E. deduction for the year 1966/67.

SESSION 1966-67

The part-time session of the College will begin on Monday, 10th October, 1966.

RE-ENROLMENTS

Students who successfully complete the 1965-66 session may be re-enrolled on receipt of application and fees from their employers. Applications should be received by 31st July, 1966, and fees not later than 27th September. No student may be registered before payment of fees is made.

NEW ENROLMENTS

Applications for engineering courses must come through a bona fide employer, and the employer must give an assurance that the candidate is engaged on work of a nature suited to the proposed course, that he is a genuine employee, and not a pupil of the sponsor.

Employers will be expected to release their students from duty at appropriate times in order that they may be able to attend classes. Day-release courses normally attend on one day (7.45 a.m. until 2 p.m.) and two evenings (6 p.m. until 8 p.m.) per week.

The following courses are offered on a day-release-with-evening basis :

Technicians' courses.—Two separate three-year courses leading respectively to the Mechanical and Electrical Technicians' Part I or Intermediate certificates examinations of C.G.L.I. These courses will replace the Ordinary Certificate courses of C.G.L.I. Qualifications for entry are :—

(a) a W.A.S.C. including Mathematics, a suitable Science subject and one other subject.

(b) four G.C.E. passes at Ordinary level, including English, Mathematics and a suitable Science subject, or

(c) a pass at J2 level of the Ordinary Certificate examinations of C.G.L.I. or

(d) satisfactory completion of G.T. course.

Laboratory Technician course.—A three year course based on C.G.L.I. syllabus 119. Students who complete the course may sit the full-time final examinations to qualify for the Yaba Laboratory Technicians' Diploma as well as the C.G.L.I. certificate.

Entry qualification is a W.A.S.C. with a credit in Mathematics and in any other two science subjects, but there is a preparatory evenings-only course for those not fully qualified, but having suitable experience. Private students may be enrolled for this course.

Advanced Laboratory Technician course.—A two year course based on City and Guilds of London Institute course 119. Qualification required :

Possession of the Ordinary (or Intermediate) certificate of C.G.L.I. together with at least two years practical experience or alternative qualification of G.C.E. 'A' level in two Science subjects plus three years subsequent laboratory experience.

Subjects offered : Chemistry and General School Laboratory. Other subjects might be available if candidates can make arrangements for tuition in special techniques.

Pottery.—A vocational course for teachers and others interested in practical pottery, theory and design. Private students may be enrolled for this course.

Basic course in Bookbinding and Warehouse.—A three year course leading to the C.G.L.I. examination in Bookbinding and Printing Warehouse Practice. It is essential for this course that students are normally employed in bookbinding or Warehouse work. Qualification required : Employment in Industry and possession of a minimum of standard six.

Tuition Fees and Method of application.—Tuition fee is £5 per session in courses where attendance is for 10 hours per week, and pro rata for other weekly hours of attendance. Students are expected to join the Students' Union, at a special reduced fee of 2s-6d per year. External examination fees, where applicable, are not included in the tuition fee.

EVENING COURSES—SESSION 1966-67

The part-time session of the College will begin on Monday, 10th October, 1966.

RE-ENROLMENTS

Students who complete the 1965-66 session may, re-enrol on payment of fees between 8 a.m. and 2 p.m., or between 5.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. on September 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th and 9th. Those who succeed in the sessional examinations and who satisfy the conditions for homework, classwork and attendance will be promoted. Others who complete session but who are unsuccessful may repeat the class, but no student will be permitted to repeat a class more than once.

Students who attended in earlier years (before 1965-66) but do not attend during session 1965-66 may re-apply as new enrolments (see below) giving details of their previous attendance.

NEW ENROLMENTS

Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates for the following evening courses:

General Technical.—A two-year course preparatory to entry to the more advanced Technicians' courses in Engineering, Building and Laboratory Technology. The minimum qualification for entry is a Government Secondary IV Certificate.

This course replaces the former Junior Ordinary Certificate course, from which present students will be converted.

Technicians' courses.—Three separate three-year courses leading respectively to the Mechanical, Electrical and Construction Technicians Part I or Intermediate certificates examinations of C.G.L.I. Qualifications for entry are:

(a) a West African School Certificate including Mathematics, a suitable Science subject, and one other subject, or

(b) four G.C.E. passes at ordinary level including English, Mathematics and a suitable Science subject, or

(c) a pass at J.2 level of the Ordinary Certificate examinations of C.G.L.I., or

(d) satisfactory completion of G.T. course.

Structural Details.—A three-year course based on C.G.L.I. syllabus No. 288 leading to the examinations for the Structural Detailing certificate. Part I examinations are taken after the second year.

This course is for draughtsmen who are not intended to qualify professionally as structural engineers. It is essential that students are normally fully employed on drawing, as little actual drawing-board work is taught after the first year. The subjects of the course are:

1st year.—Drawing Office Practice, Construction and Science, Mathematics and Mechanics,

2nd year.—Construction and Detailing, Structural Theory and Mathematics,

3rd year.—Structural Detailing, and Principles and Details for:

(a) Re-inforced and Prestressed Concrete, or

(b) Structural Steelwork.

Commercial (R.S.A.).—A four-year course of one junior and three senior years. The senior stages prepare students for the R.S.A. single-subject examinations at corresponding stages. Qualification for entry to the junior stage is the First School Leaving certificate. Candidates holding Secondary IV certificates may be considered for entry to the senior stages if vacancies exist.

This is a group course, and promotion within the course is obtained only by passing (or being exempted from) all the subjects of each stage. Subject exemptions will be given for success in internal or R.S.A. examinations. The subjects of the first year of the course are English, Geography and Commercial Arithmetic; and of subsequent years, English, Geography, Book-keeping, Commerce and Economics.

Stenography (R.S.A.).—A four-year course of one preliminary year and three senior years. The senior stages prepare students for the corresponding R.S.A. examinations in Shorthand, Typewriting, Secretarial Duties and English. Minimum qualification for entry to the preliminary stage is the Government Class IV certificate. Entry to appropriate stages of the senior course may be given to holders of R.S.A. certificates in both shorthand and typewriting if vacancies exist. This is a group course, but students of proved ability may proceed to higher stages in one or two subjects while continuing the remaining subject(s) at a lower level.

Stenography (High Speed).—A special course for holders of R.S.A. certificates of 100 w.p.m. in shorthand and 50 w.p.m. in typewriting. The object of the course is to coach competent stenographers for speeds in excess of 120 w.p.m. in Shorthand; but there is no upper limit to speeds which might be attained.

Accountancy.—A five-year course in two stages preparing students for examinations of A.C.C.A. The first three years are in preparation for the intermediate examinations, and the last two for the final examinations. The final examination may be taken in two parts. Qualification for entry to the intermediate stage is a pass in the preliminary examinations of A.C.C.A. and registration as student of A.C.C.A. Entry to the final stage is by passing the intermediate examinations of A.C.C.A.

Secretaryship.—A five-year course in two stages preparing students for the examinations of C.I.S. and C.C.S. The first three years are in preparation for the intermediate examinations and the last two for the final examinations. The final examinations may be taken in two parts. Qualification for entry to the intermediate stage is a pass in the preliminary examinations of C.I.S. or C.C.S. and registration as student of C.I.S. or C.C.S. Entry to the final stage is by a pass in the intermediate examinations. The college coaches students for the Accountancy and Secretaryship examinations but does not enter them for these examinations and students have to make their own arrangements with the examining bodies.

Monotype-Keyboard.—A three-year course in Monotype keyboard operation, open only to students employed as compositors or as keyboard operators.

Linotype.—A one-year course in Linotype operation, open only to students employed as compositors or Linotype operators.

Art Courses.—Four-year vocational courses in Drawing, Painting, Design, Illustration, Lettering, Portraiture, Sculpture, Textile Design, Silk-screen Printing and Pottery. Admission is by interview, and is open to teachers and others in relevant professions. A number of places are offered to others wishing to study these subjects either for interest or in preparation for examinations.

TUITION FEES AND METHOD OF APPLICATION

Preliminary and Junior Courses.—£2-10s per session.

Senior and Professional Courses.—£4 per session, of 4 evening per week or *pro rata* according to weekly hours.

Part time students are expected to join the College Students' Union at a special reduced fee of 2s-6d per year.

External examination fees, where applicable, are not included in the above. Students must supply their own stationery, text-books and instruments, of a type and quality specified by the College. Engineering and Building students will be provided with drawing-boards, but are advised to supply their own T-squares.

Laboratory Technician.—A two-year course leading to the Science Laboratory Technician's examinations of C.G.L.I. Applicants should possess a West African School Certificate with credits in Mathematics and two Science subjects, but consideration may be given to others who can show evidence of adequate practical laboratory experience. Success in this course entitles the student to the award of a Yaba Diploma.

Art.—Two- and three-year courses open to candidates of not less than 18 years of age who hold a West African School Certificate or equivalent and can show evidence of artistic aptitude. In exceptional cases, candidates with lower qualification may be admitted.

General Art: A two-year intermediate level course in the various departments of Fine and Commercial Arts and Crafts.

Commercial Art: Two years' vocational training designed to produce Studio Assistants for advertising and similar trades.

Fashion Design: A three-year course in Dress Design and Fashion Illustration.

Printing.—Two three-year courses leading to the Intermediate stage of C.G.L.I. examinations in the relevant branches of the industry. (Letterpress Machine Printing, and Compositors' Work).

Applicants should possess a West African School Certificate, but consideration may be given to those who show evidence of an adequate standard of education. Previous experience in the printing trade is desirable, but not essential.

Applicants must state the precise course required (Machine work or Compositor's work).

Watch-Repairing.—A three-year course giving vocational training in watch-repairing, open to holders of Government Secondary IV Certificates. Selection will be by aptitude test, and tests may be conducted in the Regions if numbers justify it.

By special arrangement with the Swiss Watch Industry, the fee for this course is reduced to £3 for the session.

Accountancy and Secretaryship.—Separate two-year courses open to those who have passed the preliminary examinations of A.C.C.A., C.C.S. or C.I.S., or who have been granted exemption therefrom by the relevant Association, or who hold a West African School Certificate with credits in four subjects including English and Mathematics.

Applicants must signify which of these three Associations' curricula they wish to follow.

At present, the courses extend only to the intermediate level of the professional bodies' examinations. The College Diploma in Accountancy or Secretaryship will be awarded on successful completion of the course.

Stenography.—Entry to this course is open to holders of a West African School Certificate. (ii) a federal form of government, as a system of government best suited to the demands of a developing country like Nigeria in modern times and most likely to satisfy local needs without hampering the emergency of a strong united democratic Nigeria.

(i) One-party system,

(ii) Multi-party system, as a system best suited to Nigeria.
